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January 7, 2013 Supervisors Meeting

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting on January 7, 2013, immediately following their reorganizational meeting; as advertised. Present were Matt Young Chairman, Allen Beckett Vice Chairman and Joseph Dan Golliday Supervisor. Also present were Secretary, Joyce Shindledecker, Liberty Police Chief, Matt Harvey, Township SEO, Dean Shultz, Road Superintendent Ed Wenschhof and Mike Wenschhof.

Public in attendance were Nancy Bushey, Harry Scott, K.C. Meadows, Charles Shindledecker, Tax collector, Brenda Snyder, Zoning member Roger Johnson and Tom Wolf.

Matt Young brought the meeting to order.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the minutes of the December 12, 2012 meeting. 3-0

Joyce had prepared a new financial statement for December excluding the truck which had not yet arrived. The Supervisors signed the new statement.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the financial statement from December until January 7, 2013 revising it to exclude the 850.00 to 5 Star international. 3-0 Total funds on hand at the present \$408,181.05. Joyce added that the check for the 1983 Int'l tuck arrived 3690.00. Matt added that an additional cost for the new 2013 truck may be 775.00 for an automatic tarp instead of a manual; as the manual is hard to pull.

Public Comment-None

Police Report-Matt Harvey gave the police report--There were 44.5 hrs for patrol, 275.75 hrs on call, 26.25 hr on incidents, 2 call outs, 146 patrol checks, 10 vehicles stopped, 6 traffic citations, 8 warning notices. A full police report is on file.

Road Report-Ed submitted the following report-

- Installed plow on 1983 Int'l for resale
- Checked a driveway for a permit on Baust property at Middle Creek Road
- Ed went for breathalyzer test CDL requirement
- A culvert was opened at Gordon Road
- Signs straighten, trash pickup cleared leaves and debris from roads
- Potholes filled on Rohrbaugh and Natural Dam road with gravel
- Spreader was picked up to install on new truck
- Plowed and antiskid roads
- Misc shop maintenance work
- A total of 86 hours for the month

There was discussion on the Baust driveway. Ed stated trees were taken down and he was satisfied. Matt suggested Ed and Linus look at the driveway ordinance again in case any

changes need to be made to the ordinance. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to accept the road report. 3-0

Secretary report-
2013 Sewage fee Schedule-Dean Shultz of Gettysburg Engineering had prepared the resolution. There were no increases from 2012. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the resolution 3-0 the resolution will be forwarded to DEP.

Mason Dixon Country Club Sewage Module Checklist-the checklist had been reviewed by Dean Shultz of Gettysburg Engineering and Attorney Linus Fenicle. Joyce signed the checklist and sent it to Gannett-Fleming. Tom Wolf, liaison of MDCC, stated that the review period has been extended until the March 13th meeting, but requested any questions/concerns be ready for the February 13 meeting. The Module is going to be reviewed page by page by Linus Fenicle, Dean Shultz and William Hill. The Planning Commission Board is welcomed to review the module along with the Supervisors.

Blue/Gray Alliance Reenactment-Scheduled for June 27-June 30, 2013. K.C. Meadows represented Blue Gray stated this was an ongoing plan and he liked the way the township works on this plan. Since the letter of intent he said registrations have gone 3 fold. If conditional approval is given, the planners can move forward with the Penn Dot contracts.

Dean Shultz stated that he had received another packet from the Blue Gray Alliance. The packet is very near complete. Dean's letter to the township dated January 4, 2013 goes over line items.

1. A faxed lease copy was received from the Baddick at 804 Cunningham Road. The lease mentions that the civil war battles will be conducted over 4 days starting on June 27. This conflicts with the plan submitted for review and approval, which states re-enactment battles will only be for 3 days and all camping re-enactors will occur on Nancy Bushey's property. The permit being requested and approved is subjected to that proposed in the Plan, not this lease. The Baddick have stated that their property is where Doubleday traveled and Baddick intends to have re-enactors portray this historical feeling. Dean sated this would be about 20-30, no more than 50 re-enactors if anymore the Baddick's would have to apply for a special event.
2. The parking lot requirements are ok
3. The parking lot layouts are ok with width of the road being 20 feet with 150' of stone
4. A resolution/agreement for the amusement tax for fees for spectators, re-enactors and sutlers as in the plan should be consulted/reviewed with Linus Fenicle for the collection and distribution. (The township and the Gettysburg School Board split the 10 percent amusement tax.)
5. The township must grant a variance to allow the event to exceed 48 hours. There was discussion of the time; set up starts June 26 until Sunday June 30. K.C. Meadows stated there is a Federal Cavalry event at McPherson Ridge and re-enactors attending will be out of the Bushey property by Tuesday July 2, 2013

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early morning. There will be no camping at the Bushey property until the next reenactment starts the following weekend. K.C. Meadows stated that clean up will proceed as the event goes.

- 6. The township must determine what amount of bond or escrow money be provided. This Agreement must be addressed by the township solicitor.
- 7. Special Events Ordinance Section 501-C Indemnitor-Linus Fenicle should advise what is required; as Dean did not know. K.C. Meadows stated the 3 million dollar policy will list Freedom Township
- 8. Allen Beckett the EMA director, newly appointed, has requested the plan be revise to provide a backup location for the Operations Center if an emergency should occur which requires it to be moved. Gloryridge Camp Gettysburg Road will be this location. Also a fire truck must be on site from Friday until Sunday. K.C. Meadows stated this has been done and he cannot disclose the information as there has been interference on fire protections. Dean is aware of the name though. Closer to the event they will have to submit the type of equipment.
- 9. Matt Harvey Police Chief has request the plan be revised to show that security will be proved 24 hours a day from Wednesday until Monday morning and to show the traffic control will be provide at the entrance to the Lorenzo property, as a minim from 7:00 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Friday Saturday and Sunday.
- 10. Dean suggests the township could consider giving approval to the plan subjected to permits and contract being provided to the township by April 10, 2013 for the following. If contracts and permits are not proved by this date, the permit will be void.

Permits-temporary Penn Dot highway entrance permits for all driveways off of the public roads to the sires, and necessary permit from the Adams County Conservation District for any construction or grading proposed
 There will be a shuttle from the Baddicks; although they is probability that people will walk down Cunningham Road. K.C. Meadows stated he would like to post sign along the right away. Matt Harvey suggested contacting Ron Hagerman that this is being done. The bridge across the Lorenzo property-golf carts will be able to go through the bridge.
Contracts-porta johns, times and how they will be cleaned, **water tankers**, how may and where the water to coming from, (Dean will review) **security personnel, traffic control flagman** (Matt Harvey will review)
Fire protection, emergency service ambulance, medics, EMT's), (Allen will review) **shuttle bus** (Dean and Matt Harvey will review) and **refuse**. (Dean will review)
Insurance -an insurance listing Freedom Township officials, employees, agents and appointees as additional defendant. Attorney Fenicle must review and approve this insurance policy.
 Sewage permit a sewage permit must be secured form the Township's SEO for the porta-johns

- 11. The township may provide a letter to Blue Gray Alliance regarding the issuance of the event permit to allow Blue Gray to apply to PennDot for a flag man permit for traffic control
- 12. We assume that the parking of the cavalry re-enactor vehicles will be as shown on the Site Plan. If this is incorrect, the plan must be revised.

Dean stated that everyone has done a lot of work on the plan. Now the planners need to do what is in the plan. Dean suggested talking to residents, handing out tickets in case they want to attend the event. Having good public relations with the residents is important.

There was discussion of the flagger force. The supervisors would like 20 flaggers (adding four extra) to the original plan on Saturday and Sunday. With this large event as anticipated the traffic will backup and even with Cumberland helping to direct traffic the extra 4 are needed.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to give conditional approval that the 12 items listed above in Dean's letter of January 4, 2013 with the 4 added flagman be met by April 10, 2013 or the permits will be Null & Void. 3-0

Letter from Dean Shultz to James Hobbs- A letter was sent to Mr. James Hobbs on January 4, 2013 stating that the property Parcel No 13E18-0044-000 was in violation of the Freedom Township Zoning Ordinance. In the letter Dean states that Mr. Hobbs has the right to appeal to the Freedom Township Zoning Hearing Board within 30 days. Mr. Hobbs attended the township meeting with a letter stating that he will file application with the zoning hearing Board in the next 30 days. The Board will not pursue the violation as long as Mr. Hobbs submits the application. Mr. Hobbs was given an application by the secretary. Dean added that he had not sent Modern Transportation a letter. Dan Golliday states that Modern Transportation knows about the zoning issue and is part of the equation going first to the Gregory's/Koontz property and now to Mr. Hobbs.

COG(Council of Government) Joyce stated that the COG would like itemized what the township is putting out for bids in the ext few weeks. She stated that we have already bid stones for the year. And we probably aren't sure of what road bids we are doing as of yet.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to drop out of the COG. 3-0
Matt stated that we had paid more for the painted lines by going with the COG.

No further discussion.

Matt made a motion with a second by Dan to adjourn 3-0

Minutes February 13, 2013

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their meeting on February 13, 2013 at the township building at 8:00 pm. Supervisors Matt Young, Allen Beckett, and Dan Golliday were present along with Secretary Joyce Shindledecker. Also present were Solicitor Linus Fenicle, Andy Hansen, Liberty Police department, Dean Shultz, William Hill, Township Engineers, Sherrin Poland, Greenmount Fire Company, and Ed And Mike Wenschhof, township road crew. Public in attendance were Tom Wolf, Duke Martin, Tim Weston, Charles Shindledecker, Roger Johnson, Zoning member, and Dale Gladfelder.

Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the minutes of January 7, and the reorganizational meeting of the same night. 3-0

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the financial report for the period. 3-0

Public comment-Sherrin Poland gave the Greenmount Fire Company report for January 5 calls with 2 structure fires, 1 chimney fire, 1 MVA and one commercial. Sherrin could not recall if they were all in Freedom Township. (one was in Freedom)

Police Report-Andy Hansen gave the following report --Freedom Patrol 75.5 hrs, Freedom on call 456.75 hours, Freedom incidents 21.25 hrs, 4 call out, Patrol Check 224, vehicles stopped 17, traffic citation/arrests 11, warning notices 9. A full report is available at the township.

Road Report-Ed submitted the following report-

- plow and anti-skidded roads several times,
- Two loads of antiskid delivered by Welty, from the quarry,
- picked up kerosene and supplies from Emmitsburg Getty Zurgables Hardware and Hagameyer electric supply,
- the new truck was delivered on January 23, 2013.
- Ed met with John Johns from Pirma to go over the building inspection.
- They did misc maintenance on the trucks, did trash pickup (tires wheels and lamps on Shorb Mill Road),
- they replaced some signs that were pulled out on Scott and Knorr Roads.

There was a total of 91 hours for the month. Allen Beckett made am motion with a second by Matt Young to accept the report. 3-0

Secretary Report-Blue/Gray Alliance Reenactment -no updates

Resolution Blue/Gray Amusement tax/Admissions-Joyce gave the township ordinances she had to Linus to review prior to his writing the resolution suggested by Township engineer Dean Shultz as one of the requirements of the permit.

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Hobbs/Modern Transportation-James Hobbs had requested a zoning hearing-appealing the Zoning officer determination-the Board upheld Dean's determination. Hobbs also requested a special exception for having a trucking business in the light industrial zoning area specifically 4430 Emmitsburg Road. Hobb's testified he had had the business since 1970 as a trucking business, primarily with his own trucks, but more recently had lease ¼ acres to Modern Transportation, a trucking company who hauls to the Grit mill at Greenstone. The board granted the special exception as an expansion of the business with several conditions that must be adhered to. The finding of facts will be written by zoning solicitor, James Yingst, in the upcoming week. One of the conditions is a parking plan to be presented and approve by the board of supervisors with setbacks. No land development plan is required and the Planning commission board does not have to review the parking plan.

Gettysburg Area School District Tax collector-the School Board has voted to increase their portion of the payment to the township tax collectors. Joyce gave the letter from the Board with the specifics that need to be advertised prior to the November election to Linus to write the resolution.

Middle Creek Bible Conference Tax Appeal-MCBible Conference is appealing the payment of taxes. The County and the School have the most at stake in this appeal. Linus stated that they will be the authorities that will attend the hearing set by the Court of Common Pleas in March, 2013.

Waste Contract Bidding Participation-Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the County bidding out the waste contracts for the upcoming 3 years. 2013 was the extended year for the last contract. Freedom has been served by Park's Garbage Service in the current contract. 3-0 motion passed.

Mason Dixon Country Club Sewage Module-The township solicitor, Linus Fenicle and one of the supervisors, Allen Beckett and Engineer Dean Shultz with the help of engineer William Hill have reviewed the Sewage Module at length. They have responded to MDCC with 6 items that still need to be addressed by the developer before the Board will approve the Module to move to DEP.

1.The outline of concerns include their reservations on the type of wastewater treatment sewer system proposed. This is not a new item questioned by the board. The main concern is that this type of treatment plant is not a conventional typed and is not used anywhere in the immediate surroundings. Therefore the Board feels it will be hard if at any point the township would become of custodians of the plant they would not have resources to go to for any help they may need. Tim Weston has raised these concerns with the developer, but they want to maintain their reasons for keeping this type of system. The system according to their engineer is not as costly to build and it can be built it sections as the phases of the development unfold. The developer is holding their ground on implementing this time of system. DEP will decide if this type of system is appropriate for this development when the plan goes to them for review.

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on March 13, 2013, at the township building. All Supervisors, Matt Young Allen Beckett and Dan Golliday were present along with Secretary Joyce Shindledecker. Also present were SEO/Engineer Dean Shultz, Engineer William Hill, Liberty Police Chief, Matt Harvey, Solicitor Linus Fenicle, Road Superintendent, Ed Wenschhof, Neil Price, Greenmount Fire Co representative.

Public in attendance were Charles Shindledecker, Tom Wolf, Nancy Bushey, Duke Martin, K.C. Meadows, Tim Weston, Zoning Member, Rodger Johnson, Mr. & Mrs. Cass Holloway and Times reporter Andrew Robinson.

Matt Young brought the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the minutes of the February 13, 2013 meeting. 3-0

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the financial report with an amendment to add 120.00 paid to Matt Young as a reimbursement for Christmas Gifts for the three township employees. 3-0

Public Comment-None

Police Report-Chief Harvey gave the following report: Freedom Patrol 61 hrs, on Call 361.5 hrs, Incidents 26.25 hr, vehicles stooped 17, citations/arrests 15, Warning notice 4, callouts 4. Police Harvey also reported that the American Odyssey Relay will be held on April 26 and 27, 2013. They have sent in their insurance policy, 3 million. They are three people cycling through at a time and people will be set up along the roadways to help any cyclist needing help. Township Roads affected are Bullfrog, Pumping Station, Red Rock Waterworks, Camp Gettysburg and McGlaughlin.

Road Report-Ed submitted the following report: checked road for debris and did trash pickup, replaced and reinstall missing curve sign and marker posts on Scott and Knorr Roads, Took down broken leaning tree on Scott road and removed lib form wires on Middle Creek road, check complaint about clogged culvert on Middle Creek road at the Sells, Salt and antiskidded roads on the 29, misc shop and equipment maintenance down, sent in salt contract for 2013-2014 season, return 4 PA 1 calls, met with Dean Shultz to go over permit compliance for Scott road ditch cleaning. Kirby Smith of Red Rock Road would like more speed limit signs installed. Matt Harvey will look that over on Monday. The township has signs so no new ones are needed. Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to accept the road report. 3-0.

Greenmount Fire Company Report-Neil price read the following: 8 calls for February 1 inside investigation Frederick, 1 brush fire Cumberland, 1 Rescue Cumberland,

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2 Accidents Freedom, 1 residential fire Cumberland, 1 transfer Frederick, 1 CO alarm Cumberland.

Neil stated the last fund raiser was very successful. A lot of people came out.

Secretary Report:

Mason Dixon Country Club-Joyce reported that Tim Weston had commented on all of the questions brought up at the last meeting by the solicitor, engineers and Board members in a letter of March 8, 2013. The next step would be to vote or not on sending the Sewage module to DEP.

Solicitor Linus Fenicle stated that the facilities agreement must be finalized. The security for operation and maintenance must be in the agreement. He explained the O & M Bond is 50 % the 1st and 2 yr of the cost of the Waste Water Plant, 2 million dollars. Then after year 2, the bond would be reduced to 10% of the installed construction cost of the facility. William Hill stated he was satisfied, but would like more signers on the signer page. He also would like the signatures notarized. Weston stated that the acknowledgement page was the same. Linus stated that he would make sure the township was legally covered with regards to the signatures.

Dean comments on the things he felt were necessary to point out to DEP

To look closely at the type of waster water treatment plant proposed, approvals from Maryland for the ponds, and focus on the effluent that spray irrigations be used and not as much going into streams.

He wanted these conditions added to the resolution so that DEP gives special concerns to these.

He also asked that all of the changes that have been made be updated in the sewage modules, as these will be the permanent record going forward.

Linus stated that the plan will be forwarded to DEP if approved with the transmittal letter and a separate document appended to the resolution of the above. Matt Young nodded approval of all the items mentioned. Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the Sewage Modules subject to the language above included in the agreement. 3-0

Blue/Gray Alliance Re-enactment: The Board received a letter from Mark Way on March 13, 2013 updating the Board on the ongoing direction and progress of the event organization.

Dean Shultz went over the letter

Dean advised the Board not to grant variances at this time on the Port 0 lets or the Water because it is early and they may in fact have more spectators and re-enactors than they now anticipate. He advised that this can be looked at closer to the event. K.C. meadows stated that when contracting they are liable for the full amount contracted for the Port o lets and the Water. Dean stated that he was sure they could adjust the contracts if need be.

Dean stated that the Plans are coming along but he had heard just today that John Baddick who had originally (thought) to have 20-40 to camp at their property now want 1,000. to camp there and then proceed to walk from their property to the reenactment, marching. Dean stated that if this is occurring, the plan would have to start over.

K.C. Meadows agreed that Baddick wanted his own friends originally to camp on his property, there is always one loose cannon, they know who is making the inquiries and they will not be 1,000 people camping, just 20-40 as originally.

The big issue now seems to be the traffic—K.C. Meadows stated that he will have a plan for the State Police and John Eline. Meadows also commented that he never knew prior to this event, never dreamed of the all the endangered species, they are jumping through hoops with the footbridges.

Hobbs Transportation-the Zoning Hearing Board had upheld Dean Shultz enforcement notice.

The Zoning Hearing Board placed several conditions on the Hobbs when granting the special exception to expand a nonconforming use of the property in the vicinity of the barn used by Modern Transportation for the storage and the pick-up and delivery of tractors and trailers.

- Applicant must prepare and submit to the Board of supervisors a stuffy under Section 1402.b of the ordinance which provides the Supervisors with information regarding the use of the area of concern, the estimated number of trips to and from the site and parking duration and the lay-out of the site so that the Supervisors can determine the appropriate number of parking spaces and the appropriate and safe lay-out thereafter

- The applicant shall define the entrance and exit to/from the area of concern to a fixed width in order to enhance vehicular safety on Emmitsburg Road. The supervisors shall review and approve the width and location of said entrance as part of their review of the parking area under Section 1402.b
- A dusk to dawn light shall be erected and maintained at the entrance to the parking area to enhance the visibility of same but which light shall be directed downward so as not to be a safety hazard for traffic using Emmitsburg Road
- The tractors and trailers parked in the area of concern shall be set back from the right-of-way of Emmitsburg Road as required by township ordinance or as otherwise determined to be necessary for safety reason by the supervisors through the review of the parking area under Section 1402.B. The lay-out of the parking area approved under Section 1402.B by the Supervisors shall include a determination of the appropriate setback for said tractors and trailers.
- All tractor trailers entering or exiting the property shall be pulled onto or from the site in a frontwards direction. No backing of tractor trailers into or from the site shall be permitted.
- Any future expansion of the site or any change of use of the Property shall be subject to the applicant filing an application for a special exception before the Zoning hearing Board.

Matt asked if the Board could override any of the Zoning Board's decision. Linus No The applicant and/or the Board of Supervisors have the right to appeal the decision in the next 30 days until April 9, 2013. They will know this by the Supervisors next meeting on April 10, 2013.

Steven Gregory-There was discussion on the Gregory property, the Gregorys had come before the Board several months ago on the Modern transportation issue because of the letter from Dean Shultz to Gregory.

The Board stated that as of now the Gregory's are not in violation of any ordinance since all the trucking aspects are within the same realm as used by Mr. Koontz for many years, this being 18-19 trucks and only using the left side of the road. Linus agreed there should not be any enforcement letter at this point.

Letter from Dr. Enriquez-Enriquez had sent a letter to the Board on the issues of the Hobb's modification of land affecting their driveway with an increase in water flow stressing the culvert at their driveway. Rusty Ryan has agreed to meet with Dean and look at the situation at the Enriquez property.

J.P. Harris Associates, LLC agreement-Joyce stated that J.P. Harris has collected delinquent taxes for townships for the past 40 years. Several townships have no record of an agreement, so Harris is requesting a 3 year signed agreement to continue the job they have done in the past. The Board made a motion to table the agreement until they and the solicitor can review the agreement.

Linus Fenicle, Solicitor, Gettysburg Engineering's Dean Shultz, Liberty Police Chief, Matt Harvey, Neil Price, Greenmount Fire Company rep, Brenda Snyder, Tax Collector and Road Superintendent, Ed Wenschhof were also in attendance. There was 1 summary arrest, 7 misdemeanor arrests and 2 felony arrests for the month. A full report is filed at the township. Matt Harvey stated that he had heard from MS and they will have their annual bike race on July 13, 2013 and Freedom will be named on the insurance. Roads affected in Freedom Township are Pumping Station Road and Bullfrog Road

Secretary Report-Robert Plank lot addition

Robert & Lois Plank submitted an acre lot addition to be adjoined to Piece Lewis, neighbor. The Planning Commission, A.C. Planning Commission and Gettysburg Engineering reviewed the plan, with favorable comments. The Freedom Township Planning Board voted to move the plan to the Supervisors along with the planning & non-building waiver declaration for approvals and the latter to be sent to DEP.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the subdivision plan and forward the necessary documents to DEP. 3-0 Joyce stated she would hold the plan for recording until DEP replied.

Dean Shultz asked that Pierce Lewis submit back to the township documentation stating that the lot addition cannot be subdivided or used as an individual lot to be sold. This all appears on the plan.

MDCC Sewage Module-Linus stated that there was nothing further. He and the developer's solicitor are fine tuning the documents before the Board signs and transmits to DEP.

Blue/Gray Reenactment- K.C. Meadows, representative of the reenactment, stated that there were two items to be cleared-The insurance is not in the packet-will have tomorrow morning and they had lost the waste dumpster contract.

Matt Harvey was concerned on the Penn Dot permits, which K.C. stated were ready but a cover sheet to accompany them was the hold up of receiving them from Penn Dot.

Allen Beckett apologized to the Board on the EMT issue-he had thought everything had been taken care of, although he felt everyone was doing a very good job he would be talking to Mark (Way) in the morning.

K.C. stated it had been an exasperating day -delivering papers to Dean today and tonight-- brought an updated packet to the meeting tonight.

Dan Golliday stated that there was no indication that the reenactment officials would stop now (in getting the requirements).

Dean Shultz stated that K.C. Meadows had come to his office today at lunch with a handful of papers, he did not have time to review them, but added there were a lot of permits missing and now he received more, he had no idea what he actually had. Dean expressed his confidence and suggested to the Board they may give the reenactment

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officials until the May 8, 2013 meeting. He added that he wanted all the permits two weeks prior to the May 8, 2013 meeting so that he could review everything and make sure everything required was taken care of.

Linus Fenicle added that the 3,000 bond the township received was for damages to the roads or clean up of the roads. It could be used for any extra police expenses. Matt Harvey stated that he did not think that would be the case. It was not for cleaning any property owners land. There was also clarification on the 10% amusement tax with 5% going directly to the Gettysburg Area School District and 5% going to Freedom Township. Joyce added that the 2-\$2,000.00 checks used for billable hours of the solicitor and Dean Shultz's review was close to being used.

Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to allow Blue/Gray Reenactment an extension to two weeks prior (April 24, 2013) of the May 8, 2013 meeting to get all necessary documentation/permits to Gettysburg Engineer's Dean Shultz. 3-0

Hobbs/Modern Transportation-Allen Beckett stated he had spoken to Jimmy Hobbs about something other than the parking plan that the Zoning Hearing Board is requiring and Hobbs was talking about getting an NPDES permit.

Allen was unsure of what was actually taking place.

Dean stated he had seen a sketch plan from Jack Powell engineer for Hobbs of the parking plan. The Township had not received anything.

Also at the last meeting a letter from Hobb's neighbor, Dr. Enriquez had been brought to the Board's attention. Dean said that he, Dr. Enriquez and Rusty Ryan had met and looked at Enriquez driveway. He stated that a culvert was in bad shape and with cleaning there would be a lot better passage o the water. Recently there has been an increasing amount of water flowing with the Hobb's grading, fill-in.. There may be storm water management issues. He mentioned possibly installing a freeboard (at the pond) with a pipe therefore only releasing water at a rate it can go through (the pipe)

Allen Beckett asked several times during the meeting about the Board requiring a land development plan. Linus replied that the requirement from the Zoning Hearing Board was a parking plan not a land development plan. Dean stated that the plans were similar, that the parking plan would show the same things as a land development plan, only a land development plan goes to the County and Freedom Planning Boards, the parking plan only to the Supervisors.

Dean explained the need for a storm water management plan was when an additional acre is disturbed. This does not count the original area.

Dean mentioned that he was waiting for a letter of abandonment from Steve Gregory and with that they would not have to repair the septic system. He did not know if Modern Transportation was going to use the Hobb's property if the Gregory's property could be used.

Linus stated that Board did not need to take any action as the letter from Dean in response to the plan was just written on April 8, 2013.

J.P. Harris Agreement 3 years-The Agreement proposed by J.P. Harris is to continue collecting delinquent taxes for three years. Harris has been collecting delinquents for the past 40 years. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to have J.P.

Harris continue to collect the delinquent taxes. Brenda Snyder, Collector asked why the agreement was for 3 years. Joyce did not know, but they would probably just like to get written agreement to the townships that have no records of an agreement; then extensions may be forthcoming. 3-0

19 Century Baseball Event -Former Yingling Farm, Pumping Station Road, Gettysburg, Pa-Dean had spoken to the Event organizers and the event will be 2 days, July 20-21, 2013. There will be 4 ball fields, the event will be as in the civil war days, and on the Schroeder side of the farm.. Jim Fox, who has handled re-enactments, will be involved in the event. Dean stated he is not too concerned. There will be 1,000 people Dean told Allen Beckett, EMA there will be no been for ambulance on hand or any fire protection. No one is camping. They will play and go home and return the next day. Matt Young made a motion for \$500.00 up front for the review of the plan. Allen Beckett made a second to the motion. Additional review fees will be billed or refunds if not spent. 3-0 Joyce had heard from the organizers and plans will be coming out in a few days to the Township.

Planning Commission Member-Horace Waybright, a long time Planning Board member, recently passed away. Joyce told the board that former planning member, Robert Plank, who had not served the past two years, is interested in serving on the planning board again. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to appoint Robert Plank to the Planning Board to finish out the remainder of Horace's term. 3-0

Cunningham Bridge Construction-The township officials received a letter stating that construction would start on the bridge on April 22, 2013.

South Western Joint Comprehensive Plan- The board has opted out of this sometime ago per Matt Young.

Adams County Construction Standard and Material Spec Wells & Geothermal Systems- Dean explained that this is a draft plan that the County is circulating in order for townships to come on board with well inspections etc. Matt asked Linus why the County can start ordinance and then expect townships to adopt them and administer costs to the people. He did not like the plan that Straban Township has and is not in favor of this type of ordinance. The other Board members agreed they are not interested in reviewing the ordinance or giving feedback to the County. Dean added that this type of ordinance is useless unless you know the construction which is not in the ordinance.

Zoning Hearing -Cellco Tower application April 22, 2013 7:00 Gettysburg Properties Home of the Fireworks sales- The zoning hearing board has received the application. There are 7 variances asked for in the application. Linus asked if he should attend. The Board gave permission for Linus to represent the township. Dean Shultz of Gettysburg Engineer zoning officer states that there is a very small spot on the property where they wish to construct the 120 ft tower for Verizon. He states that the lot is completely used up already. He feels that we do not need a tower there. Matt Harvey

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in reply feels that a tower is necessary somewhere along 15 as the signal is not there for at least three spots along 15. Bob Jackson of Liberty Township stated that a tower had been placed in Liberty and there is room for Verizon to place a tower on this construction. He did not know why an application was brought in for Freedom location. Note-There was a site approved a few years back by the ZHB on the property of the Gettysburg Auto Auction. The plan was withdrawn a few years later.

Update Commercial Zoning Fees-Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to increase the Commercial Zoning Applications from \$300 to \$700.00 and to keep \$300.00 for residential zoning application. 3-0 The township has already incurred over \$2200.00 expenses on the Hobbs hearing without any of Dean's costs included in that.

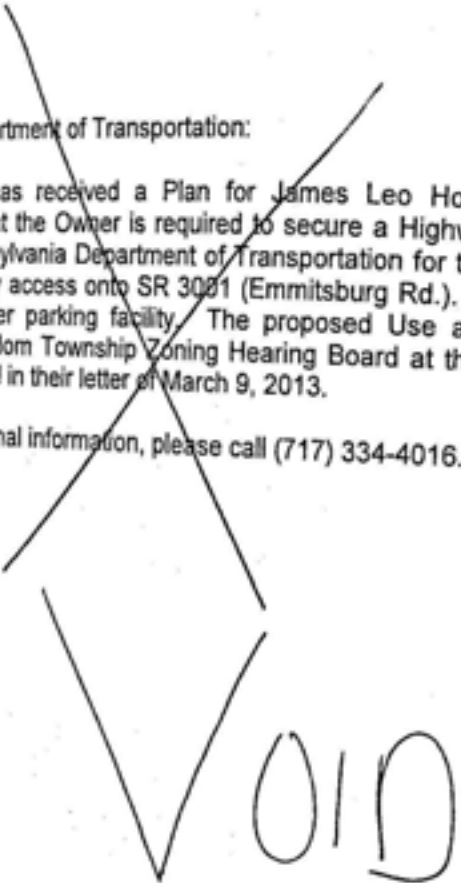

Also present were Joyce Shindedecker, Ed Wenschhof, Matt Harvey, Linus Fenicle and Dean Shultz representing the township. Public in attendance were Mike Wenschhof, Nancy Bushey, K C. Meadows, Mark Way, Brenda Snyder, Tom Wolf, Sherry Rogers-Frost, Charles Shindedecker, Steve Hobbs, James Hobbs, and Andrew Robinson of the Times.

Matt Young called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to accept the financial report Receipts \$62,004.53, included Liquid fuels for 2013 (\$40,391.26) expenses \$7,822.28 with a balance on hand in all accounts at \$404,958.46 3-0

Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to accept the minutes of the April 10, 2013 minutes. 3-0

Public Comment-none

Police Report-Matt Harvey, chief of Liberty Township Police gave the following report-Freedom Patrol 6805 hr, On Call 385.5 hrs, Incidents 34.75, Call Outs 7, vehicles stopped 23, Traffic citation/arrests 16, Warning notices8, Details 32, hours 20.75 Violations 19. A full police report is on file with the township.

Road Report-Ed wrote the following-

- checked roads, did trash pickup, clean up antiskid at intersections & bridges, clean up plowed up sod
- placed cold patch repairs on various roads
- installed 4- 30 m.p.h signs on Red Rock Road
- maintenance on the 6210 tractor and lawn mower and road mower
- took plow & salt spreader off Int'l truck
- mowing and cleanup at the township lot
- had dusk to dawn light at salt shed repaired
- picked up lumber at Greenwood Products for sideboards on the truck
- Dan, Matt and Ed did road inspection
- Received an estimate on the lettering of the new truck 100.

Dan Golliday made a motion to approve the road report with a second by Allen Beckett. 3-0

Ed will meet with Penn dot representative Gary Tipton on May 15, 2013. Then Joyce can begin the bid process after they speak, not sure if they will be ready for June meeting, but she didn't think the township would begin before the reenactment.

Greenmount Fire Company report-submitted by Brad Poland. 8 calls for the month 5 brush fires, 1 vehicle accident, 1 residential fire, and 1 fuel leak. One of the above incidents was in Freedom, 5 in Cumberland, 1 in Highland and 1 in Frederick Md.

Secretary report

Blue Gray Reenactment-Allen Beckett stated that John Eline, Dean, Allen, Nancy Bushy, and Matt Harvey and other officials had met on Wednesday and went over the emergency plan. They are satisfied, Allen expressed they (both the township and the event organizers) have done a lot of work and the organizers have worked with the township to meet the townships requirements. Everything is in working order, everything looks great. Now the State Police will do a security assessment, which freedom will adhere to their suggestions, and take the assistance they offer, and work together. Dean stated that the new packets should replace some of the documents in the old packets. Suggested the township have two copies of everything, Allen Emergency Coordinator, is holding one, the township the other. They have all the contracts for the services and supplies, the security and traffic have been finalized. The 3,000 escrow bond has been in place, the amusement tax is going to be paid tonight (first installment) \$6,870.00. An itemized paper for these funds will follow. The School District also requires an itemized list with their payment. Outstanding bills as of today our 1154.00, to be paid today. The insurance policy will be revised to include the township employees. The insurance will cover up until 6/30/2013. The insurance will not include the cleanup days. Allen Beckett fees will be \$500.00 as Emergency Coordinator at 14.60 per hour roughly 35.75 hours. On June 26, 2013 at 1:30 there will be a walk through on the Bushey property of everything that has been in the township required application; finalized. During the event, there will be shuttle service from the Baddick's (804 Cunningham Road) for the spectators and a tractor and wagon with the re-enactors to go to the Bushey site. They will be backup school buses if the spectators exceed expectations. There is a 3 million dollar insurance policy. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to give the Blue and Gray Alliance final approval with the conditions to give what is needed for the state police assessment, pay up the bills for the engineer, solicitor and emergency coordinator a payment of \$3,000. 3-0

Mark Way added that Main Street Gettysburg wants to work with the Blue & Gray with traffic flow and they asked if someone from the township would be interested in being on the Steering Committee. Joyce added that Deb Adamick had called but failed to email her the particulars in time for this meeting. Mark stated that 6106 re-enactors had signed so far and 1,528 presold tickets were sold to spectators.

Hobbs/ Modern Transportation-Jack Powell had dropped off a sketch plan and comments from Dean's letter of April 8, 2013. There was discussion that Rusty Ryan of A.C Conservation district is now requiring a storm water management plan, this had not been the case on his first inspection. There needs to be a letter to PennDot that the township acknowledges the application for a driveway permit from Penn Dot. Dean will be taking care of the letter. Jack Powell was unable to attend the meeting. Jim Hobbs did not feel there was anymore water than in the past 40 years, but did acknowledge that Jack Powell will address the Storm water issue and submit another parking plan. Dan Golliday expressed his concerns about the dust which is an issue with all the trucks. He also asked about the road route taken when the trucks leave. Matt Young stated that Hobbs said that Boyle Road was not being used and that was the township's concern, being a township road. He did not believe that the board could set a route for the trucks. His concern is our roads.

19th Century Baseball Event-Dean had received the plan submitted by the event organizers. Matt Harvey and Dean had reviewed the plan. There are 16 baseball teams with the setting being in the 1800's, with approximately 1,000 spectators for each day, July 20 and July 21, 2013. The main concern was the scale of the maps (which can be taken from the county GIS map) and water for the teams. He noted that a garden hose was the supply for water and he did not think the hose would have pressure for uphill. Matt Harvey would like at least one traffic control person on the entrance and the exit. The entrance does not have that good of a site distance. Dean is requiring 5 porta-johns versus the 4 in the application. The event is by donation only so there will not be amusement tax from the donations. There will be vendors who are paying setup fees. The little league will be in charge of the parking and they may also be given donations for the parking. Dean feels the play is incomplete and will be notifying the event organizers of changes/completions that need to be made. They will not need fire protection or emergency management as the event is a smaller one. They have paid \$500., \$100. of that for the application fee and \$400. for any expenses incurred by Deans' review and Linus review of the insurance policy. They have also paid the \$1,000. bond escrow.

Waste Contract- no one from Freedom Township had attended the meeting, but the township will be in with other townships when the bids go out.

Zoning Hearing -Cellco tower will continue on May 30, 2013 at 7:00 p.m.

Stephen Gregory/Modern Transportation has submitted a Zoning Hearing Application. The hearing will be held on Monday June 17, 2013 at 7:00 pm. Mr. Hobbs was asked that if the Gregory's get approval, will Modern Transportation move from his property. Mr. Hobbs did not know.

Comments from the public-Sherry Rodgers-Frost asked if she could put up signs on her property along the road "children at play" on Middle Creek Road. The board advised her to get with Ed Wenschhof to determine the township right of way. Matt Young ask that

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Mrs. Rodgers-Frost take note of the times of speeders and she can report to Matt Harvey. Matt Harvey stated there are very few cars on the road during their hours of patrol there. Sherry Rodgers-Frost also asked about the vehicles going through her fields, ATV's. Matt Young stated she could put up a wire fence, or cameras. She was also thinking of putting up boulders.

Tom Wolf asked about the submissions from Mason Dixon Country Club-Linus has received them and Joyce will get with Dean Shultz on the papers the township must review and sign.

Brenda Snyder-asked about a fire tax. Matt answered that he had heard nothing about it, only that it had been in the Times. Brenda complained about the fire tax increase last year and she does not want to pay a fire tax on top of that. Matt explained that the increase was a millage increase, not a fire tax.

Secretary Report-

Natural Dam Road-Solicitor Linus Fenicle told the board that a court decision on the Naill Case against the Board of Supervisors found in favor of the township and the case was dismissed. There is no active litigation in the Court by the Naills. They has been no appeal so far, the Naills attorney had 10 days to do that. Linus stated that the Board is now back to the beginning and eventually the Board will have to decide where it wants to go with this matter. Dan asked if we could leave it as it is right now. Linus' response. Yes.

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Blue/Gray Reenactment- K.C. Meadows gave an update 9665 re-enactors are register, 55 Suttlers, 4000 tickets sold to date. K.C. thanked Dean and the Board of Supervisors and stated they had brought out the best in us and wanted to thank everyone. Dan said-we made you jump through hoops but know you were capable of doing a class a event. Our concern is for the safety and welfare of the people in Freedom Township and surroundings as well. Thank you for working with, Dean we will keep our fingers crossed.

Dean Shultz stated he had been asked by two attorneys and 3 property owners about the reenactment this week. They are concerned about people walking on their property. Will the township enact trespassing? Harvey-if it is posted.

They will be roping the arears around the properties.

There was a question on the insurance-Dean checked and everything is a go. Another Company is insuring the event. And will provide the 2 million umbrella.

They will be a walk through on Wednesday, June 26, 2013 at 1:00 p.m. in the afternoon. Matt reminded the event organizers that in the event of threat of rain, to act before hand. At a previous re-enactment cars had sunken into the ground.

Matt Harvey announced that the event organizers are in the process of taking care of the suggestions given by the State Police as far a security/safety.

Tom Wolf asked how this event compares in size (to others) K.C--Smaller.

Hobbs/Modern Transportation-Dean Shultz stated he had met with Jack Powell, engineer for the applicant, and Jack is suppose to have a plan to Dean, but he has not seen one as of yet.

Dan Golliday brought up the matter of the dust-he has seen a lot and does not think anything has been done about the dust, at least to his knowledge.

Dean -when we get the plan, we will review it and put down your concerns, and then we will have the right to bring action against Hobbs. (if he does not comply).

Linus stated that there should be communications with Hobbs, the Zoning Hearing Board has put conditions on the property, Hobbs should be obeying those conditions right now, and he should be communicating with you to determine which direction to go at this point.

Some of the conditions were-- no backing onto the roadway, lighting--whatever the Zoning Board placed he should be obeying.

Dan Golliday stated that if these small requests are not adhered to it gives him no confidence that the bigger requests will be met as well.

He stated that if the truckers aren't obeying the rules they should be shut down.

Modern Transportation needs to appreciate, it is a terminal, it is only fair whether large or small they follow the rules. If the bigger guy walks over, it is unfair to the smaller guy.

Matt Young asked if a letter should be sent to Hobbs. Linus stated he would talk to Dean.

19th Century Baseball Event Shroeder Farm Pumping Station Road-Tom Duffy attended the meeting. A revised plan was submitted to Dean. Dean would like two more copies. They show a proposed entrance, but need an emergency entrance. Port a Johns are increased from 4 to five as Dean requested. The plan shows the same path as the former re-enactment showed, it shows concession stands, and the 6 baseball diamonds.

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As far as traffic concerns, Dean asks that the organizers contact the re-enactment organizers and ask for the no parking signs. Signs should be erected 1/4 mile each way. The insurance copy is in the plan. Dean is concerned about the water situation. He has been to many events and there is a need for the water. Tom Duffy states that the baseball teams know they are to bring their own water, but The Shroeders have given permission to use their spigot also. Dean suggests they have 4-5 gallon containers available to get the water to anyone who may need it. Duffy also stated that spectators are encouraged to bring food and water and have done so in the past.

Duffy questions the need for flaggers as people are coming throughout the day, not staying for all events. He stated they are small a nonprofit group, they have asked the teams to contribute in as much as cutting the grass expense.

Matt Young stated that they cannot eliminate the flaggers because of the money issues of the event organizers. The site distance is not that great at the location.. John Eline was contacted but has not replied on the flagger questions. Tom Duffy stated that he will work with Eline. The question was asked about first aide and fire extinguishers. They have trained personnel and extinguishers.

All donations that are given are given to the Gettysburg Little League. This event is open to the public on July 20 and 21, 2013. Duffy stated that the most will be 200 cars at one time. They proposed 1,000 spectators a day, counting the ball players.

Allen Beckett questioned if the Emergency Management played a part. No Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the revisions as submitted but to **not give a waiver** on the traffic control issue. 3-0

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Minutes Supervisors July 10, 2013

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on July 10, 2013 at the township building at 8: p.m. Matt Young, Allen Beckett and Dan Golliday presided over the meeting. Secretary Joyce Shindledecker, Police Chief Matt Harvey, Road Superintendent Ed Wenschhof, Solicitor Linus Fenicle and Engineer Dean Shultz also attended the meeting. Public attending were Duke Martin, Walter Stone, Ray & Betty Redding, Mike Wenschhof, K.C Meadows, Margaret Garrett and Nancy Bushey.

Chairman Matt Young called the meeting to order.

Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by matt Young to approve the minutes of the June 12, 2013 meeting. 3-0

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to accept the financial report with a total of \$447,100.09. 3-0

Public comment-None

Police Report-Matt Harvey gave the following report: Freedom Patrol 13.25 hours, Freedom On Call 385 hours, Freedom Incidents 61 hr Vehicles stopped 18, Traffic Citation/Arrests 17, Warning Notices 8; a full report is on file with the township.

Road Report-submitted by Ed Wenschhof as follows: Mowing and trimming township roadways and the township lot, cleared trees from Bullfrog and Red Tock Roads from storm on the 13th of June, Met with bidders for 1st round of bids on Boyle Road, issued temporary driveway permit for Bullfrog Road for Blue/Gray Alliance Re-enactment Use, And did maintenance work on road mower, trash pickup, and returned PA One Calls, etc Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the Road Report. 3-0

Ed stated that Will Rogers (Middle Creek Road) would like a sign put up on this end of Gordon Road CREEK CROSSING. Ed stated that he is against that because this would draw attention to a lot of people. Roger's complaint is that people get so far down the road and have to turn around and also that the dust stirs from the UPS drivers who travel this route. A Drive slow sign might help. Over 20 years Rogers has noted that only two cars flooded out and had to be pulled out. Matt Young said there was no need for another sign as there is one posted toward the creek. Dan Golliday was in agreement as long as there is a sign and a speed limit sign the township has posted what is necessary.

Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by matt Young to award the bid to the low bidder Hammaker East. 3-0

Ed's commented that over the next few years several other roads will need seal coat.

Boyle Road Excavation-Widening shoulders
Valley Quarries 89,665.00 Wilson Paving 79,971.00

The Board took a few minutes to discuss the above then a motion was made by Allen Beckett with a second to award the bid to low bidder, Wilson Paving. 3-0
There was no official date for completion on the bids only the October 31, 2013 for the asphalt to seal correctly.

Secretary Report-Blue Gray Alliance- Both Nancy Bushey, property owner, and K.C. Meadows, event representative, said it's over and never again for their part. (of course) these exact words were spoken years before by Ms. Bushey. All in all everything went fairly well. There were some challenges and EM Allen Beckett said that the weakest point was communication. Nancy stated that the battles were great and the spectators loved them. Dean commented that everyone should be thanking Matt Harvey. On Thursday re-enactors started coming in and there had been no traffic patrollers for that time period and Matt Harvey alone handled the whole traffic situation that day. Parking cars too close to the roadways was also a big problem. Dean commented that staff parking the cars left no aisle for cars to go in and out without traveling the whole length of the field. Matt Harvey stated that for future parking should be further away from the events. Spectators took to walking to their vehicles after the events (those parked at the Baddick Farm) and the roadways were congested that the shuttles could not move through.

The issue left at this time is the amusement tax. Only one check, for \$6870.00 was received in late April, 2013. K.C. Meadows will be calling Mark Way to get the information on the tickets sold and the amount of amusement tax owed to the township to the township secretary and the school district.

Hobbs/Modern Transportation- Matt Young met with Hobbs prior to this evening's meeting. Jack Powell, Engineer for the Hobbs will be meeting with Hobbs on this Friday to go over the parking plan, according to Hobbs. Matt Young told Hobbs to get the plan to Dean Shultz, then the plan will be reviewed and if anything additional needs to be on the plan, the Supervisors will let Hobbs and Powell know of their wishes. Matt Young stated that he thinks 20 more feet to the North is needed in order for trucks to pull in and move out of the way for other trucks to enter.

19th Century Baseball-
The plan has been approved with the only issue being the traffic control. The organizers would like to use American Traffic Safety instead of Construction Flaggers. Matt Harvey will email the organizers whom they need to get approval from in order for the event to have Penn Dot Approval. The event is scheduled for the Shroeder Farm (former Yingling) on July 20 and 21, 2013. The event is by donation only so no amusement tax will be coming in to the township or school district.

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A motion was made by Matt with a second by Allen that plan approvals are issue contingent to getting the proper approvals necessary from Penn Dot. 3-0

Waste Contract

Linus has reviewed the waste contracted prepared by the County Planning Commissioners and had a few suggestions for changes. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to give approval to the Commissioners staff to advertise the waste contracts with the changes implemented by our solicitor. 3-0

Natural Dam Complaints

Joyce had two calls this week referring to the area along the Bishop Property at natural Dam. The first was a non resident, Michael Grimes, who questions signs posted by the Bishops of no trespassing. He wanted to know who Bishop was and his complaint was that someone told him that is family could not swim in the creek. Matt Harvey was given the email Joyce received to respond.

The second complaint was from Cabin owner on the leased Bishop property, Margaret Garrett, who is attending the meeting tonight. Margaret witnessed a pit bull running loose, dirty diapers, beer bottles and trash thrown over the area. She and the other 3 cabin owners have taken the trash and disposed of it at their main residences. She said that the problem has start around 6 weeks ago. As many as 22 cars have been at the property at once. She stated that the land is clearly posted. In reference to this, matt Young made a visit prior to the meeting and questioned owner Robert Bishop on the posted signs. Robert had not posted the signs; therefore that part must be looked into before anyone can be prosecuted for trespassing on the property.

Matt Harvey had contacted Cumberland Township whom had posted on the Cumberland sign "No Parking" signs 15 years ago and that had helped people from parking there. Matt Harvey will look into this matter.

Natural Dam -Naill-Township counter law suit

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to withdraw the township's counter suit against the Naills at the request of the insurance attorney who had the Naill case dismissed as of last month. 3-0 The Naills had not appealed the dismissal.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to look into perhaps any **Fish and Game grants** that could be helpful with the township on the turn around issue. The County has pledged \$10,000 on there part with help. 3-0
Allen stated he would get with Rusty Ryan on the grant.

Greenmount Fire Call Report-submitted by Brad Poland --4 calls for July
1 brush fire, 1 structure fire, 2 requests for fire police
2 Freedom, 1 Mt Joy, 1 Frederick County, Md

Jeff Hardman Chief and President of the Greenmount Fire Company introduced himself. He was off his regular job tonight and decided to come to the Board for help with the dwindling fire funds and recruits.

He informed the Board that the Fire Company was losing members and two key people involved in the fund raisers, Gene and Luxie Altoff have retired as volunteers. He stated that with their retirement ¼ of the upcoming events have been cancelled including all breakfasts (with exception of October 20) for the remainder of 2013, the November 9, 2013 Shrimp feed, and the December 14, 2013 Christmas Bake Sale. The September 21, 2013 Crab feed has the date changed (none given). **Events still on are the October 6, 2013 Fire Prevention Week Open House, and the October 12, 2013 Sportsman Drawing**

Hardman began by saying the Fire Company could use financial help from the township and the community or the doors will have to be locked.

Allen Beckett stated that he had offered help to Mr. Poland and his offer was declined. Allen as the Emergency Management Coordinator appointed recently wondered why he was not asked to attend the fire company meetings.

Dan Golliday expressed concerns with giving any money to the fire company without some type of plan from the fire company on going further.

Allen stated that he had some ideas and no one seemed willing to listen.

Recruits come in, according to Harman, but do not stay.

The Board had insight into this --they way things go after the recruits attend a meeting. Dan-if effort is given results will be gotten.

More financial support from the township may be given when the Fire Company personnel find out the problems.

Dan Golliday would like a five year plan prior to committing to giving any money to the Fire Company.

The 501C3 was discussed and Hardman stated it should be ready by September 1, 2013 but this has been ongoing for many years.

The mortgage was discussed, the debt, and moving forward.

Allen mentioned a thermometer to show the debt and the goals. (Outside for the Public)

Hardman also expressed the need for drivers.

It was also suggested to get some outside assistance on how to proceed.

Hardman thanked the Board; and the Board asked for a written plan before the September 11, 2013 township meeting. Also the Board was invited to attend the Fire Company meetings on the 2nd Monday of each month.

Secretary Report-

Blue/Gray Re-enactment comments-Joyce commented she had emailed Mark Way on any money due the township from the amusement tax 5% to be paid to the township from the event. Thus far the township has received one check in late April for a \$6870... Since the event organizer had not submitted paper work to verify numbers, the township has no idea if they have met the tax. The township is holding the \$3000.00 bond and \$770.50/overage collected for other expenses until paperwork is submitted for any (outstanding) taxes.

Joyce will continue to contact Mr. Way.

Hobbs/Modern Transportation-Dean and the Township have not heard anything from Mr. Hobbs nor engineer Jack Powell on the required parking plan that the Zoning Hearing Board requested for the Board of Supervisors to review. Dean stated that he and

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solicitor Mr. Fenicle will draft a letter to Mr. Hobbs stating the above and any repercussions his non-actions make occur.

19 Century Baseball Event-the event organizer have paid to date all expenses of Dean Shultz and Linus Fenicle; therefore there \$1000.00 bond check will be returned. The organizers are holding \$45.00 in amusement tax collected from vendors. The solicitor stated this could be waived, but Matt Young did not agree. Joyce will contact the event organizers and ask them to divide the \$45.00 between the township and the Gettysburg Area School District.

Steven Gregory/Modern Transportation/Land Development Plan-the Zoning Hearing Board approved the zoning request on July 18, 2013, but one of the stipulations was to prepare a land development plan for the Supervisors to review. To date no contact has been made and no plan submitted. The land development plan would be required to go before the Planning Commission Board. The 30 day period has not expired for appeal at this time.

Verizon Cellular Tower-Verizon has been in contact with solicitor Linus Fenicle and Dean Shultz to possibly come back to the Zoning Board on placing the tower at a new place at the Gettysburg Properties/ Fireworks on the Emmitsburg Road. The applicant had been denied approval previously on the location originally submitted. Matt Young stated that if variances are required, the plan should not come back to the township. The cost of a hearing is Matt's concern if there is a possibility that the plan will be denied. Dean stated that Verizon has a right to come back before the Zoning hearing Board.

Waste Contracts-Allen Beckett volunteered to attend the opening of the bids. A motion was made by Matt with a second by Dan that Allen Beckett attend the meeting when the waste contracts are opened by the Adams County Planning Board. The opening of the bids is scheduled for 9:00 a.m. on September 18, 2013 in the Historic Courtroom.3-0

Gary Siperko Weeds-At the last meeting Raymond and Betty Redding came to the meeting with a complaint on the Siperko weeds. Joyce has written a letter and sent a copy of the weed ordinance to Mr. Siperko concerning his property on Red Rock Road. Mr. Siperko sent a reply letter in length on the types of weeds on the property. Ed had gone out by the property and spoke with Mrs. Siperko who was attending to the removal of any noxious weeds. Mr. Siperko was out of town. Mr. Siperko's letter was quite knowledgeable on weeds.

Southwestern Comprehensive Plan-Paul Kellett, Planning member informed the Board that the SW Comprehensive Plan Committee has started having meetings and as a former Supervisor Mr. Kellett attended the meeting. At that time the township had the representation to hear the plans, but never stated they would change their comprehensive plan or agree to be a part of the new plan. A motion was made by Allen Beckett with a second by Matt Young to appoint Planning Member Paul Kellett to attend the meetings with the same regard. 3-0

Public Comment-

Joe Bowden, Emmitsburg Road informed the Board he would like to hold a 19th Century Event on his property next Oct 1, 2014 and use the Stone property for parking. He said there would be tickets sold to the event up to 150-160. No special event plan is required on groups under 200. Joyce will check into the amusement tax ordinance if this size group (is required).

Comments from Supervisors-thanked people for coming out.

Talcott's inspected the 1994 dodge truck, Ed and Mike did road mowing, trimming and mowing the township lot. They also did maintenance work on lawn tractor, 6210 tractor and road mower. They picked up supplies and did cold patch repairs on Middle Creek and McGlaughlin Roads. There was a total of 130 hrs for the month @ \$22.50 per hour, totaling \$2925.00 for payroll expenses. Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the road report. 3-0

No one has responded to last month's Supervisors request of a Fire Company Financial Plan
Events coming up 9/21-Crab feed, 10/12 sportsmen drawing 10/20 Breakfast Buffet (last one)

Secretary Report-

Blue Gray Reenactment-Mark Way had contacted Joyce via email stating -We are in the process of paying the last of the vendors from the event and paying the amusement tax. I am requesting some information from you so that I can remit the proper amount of tax to Freedom Township. We are paying these last \$100,000 of invoices due out of personal funds as the event surpassed it's cash on hand before we ever left the event. In the last township meeting I attended I submitted some additional funds for various things the township was projecting. Is it possible to get an accounting of the funds we paid to the township, in their entirety, and the invoices for it's use if any so that we may properly determine the amount to remit. Joyce asked Mark to submit reports for the check already received \$6870.00 in April and also to submit anymore amusement tax collected with a report. Upon receipt and review of the reports the township may return the \$3,000.00 bond held and the overage of expenses paid of \$770.50. Allen Beckett stated the organizers are holding an event in two weeks and possibly that money will pay off the township. Linus Fenicle stated that we would give them until the Oct 9, 2013 meeting, then a letter would be sent to give them 30 days, informing them of keeping the \$3000.00 bond and the \$770.50.

Hobbs/Modern Transportation-Jack Powell has submitted a plan to Mr. Dean Shultz, but not officially to the Township which Dean sent to Joyce via email. Dean stated that plans need to be submitted to the township secretary, not sent by email. Mr. Powell included a letter dated 9/1/2013 with the following:

1. All proposed parking is placed at least 25' from the street right-of-way line.
2. A traffic study outlining the site usage is being provided with this submission.
3. A Penn DOT driveway permit is being applied for.
4. A dust-to-dawn light is proposed at the driveway entrance.
5. The plan indicates a "dust-free" surface of rolled millings, tar and chip, or similar surface treatment.
6. As indicated by the maneuvering limits, additional fill is being placed in order to comply with the ZHB Decision Item 5 which requires the tractor trailers to be able to pull onto and from the site in a frontwards direction. The fill is for safety / compliance reasons and not for "additional parking spaces". The total number of indicated parking spaces (34) is less than the number of vehicles referenced (40) in the Zoning Officer's letter dated Jan. 4, 2013.
7. An analysis of the site occupancy based upon a June 7, 2005, USDA Farm Service Agency aerial photograph of the site (and in accordance with the Zoning Hearing Board's Findings that operations have occurred at the site since 1970) lead us to **request an exemption from storm water management**. This is also supported by the CG-1 analysis in the attached Stormwater Narrative.
8. Additional runoff filtering capability is proposed in accordance with ACCD suggestions

Dean went over line item 1. shown on the plan #2 Traffic study is submitted Discussion on some trucks heading South rather than North and then South #3 he questioned why Mr. Powell did not submit for a driveway permit-Jack stated everything has to be submitted electronically and he is waiting for approval of this plan. #4 Two dusk to dawn lights installed #5 Ask what Hobbs is doing about the dust free surface-Hobbs states he will use Millings
There was discussion of what is being done now-Jack said he is with the understanding a plan is submitted prior to the actual property being taken care of, not as an as built plan.
#6 34 parking spaces. Mr. Hobbs states there is not enough room for a truck to be turning around backing up and pulling and backing up-there may be another truck waiting to pull in there is a problem for space. Allen Beckett suggests a larger area (squared off on the plan) #7 for over 30 minutes Dean and Jack Powell with a few suggestions from the Supervisors discussed stormwater. There was a big difference in the impervious area from Dean's calculations to Jack Powell's calculations. Allen suggested a retention area at the bottom, if a problem, then we will work that out. Dan Golliday stated that everything was done improperly from the beginning. Modern moved in before anyone came to the township. He wants everyone safe in the township and is asking that the plan be done and the storm water managed. Matt states that if Rusty Ryan said in the beginning there was no stormwater problem why is there one now?

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After more discussion and a lot of frustration the Board wants a finished plan by next month with a larger turn around area and a solution to the storm water issue. Also they want the Penn dot permit to be started.
Jack will get the township copies of the parking plan.

19th Century Baseball Event-the co-coordinators of this year's event have via email stated they want to hold an event July 19-20, 2014 at the Shroeder property on Pumping Station Road. A motion by Allen with a second by Dan to forward a memo written by Dean to the coordinator recommending 6 line items to be addressed for the event next year. Joyce has already responded to the organizers that a plan will need to be submitted and fees will be charged for the review, amusement tax on the refreshment stands and the \$100 application fee when the plan is submitted, then a few months before the event the \$1,000.00 bond be posted. Just as this year's event. 3-0 Dean will forward the memo to Joyce to send out.

Gregory Modern Transportation Land Development Plan-Jack Powell engineer is meeting with the Gregors in a few days. The plan will be submitted to the township secretary for the Planning Commission review and will also be submitted to the Adams County Planning Commission and Dean Shultz for review.

Verizon Cellular Tower-an application has been made to the township for a Zoning Hearing for the Celco Partnership d/b/a Verizon Wirelsss to construct and operate a cellular phone tower facility including an antenna support structure at 3640 Emmitsburg Road at the Fire Works Retail Store. The Hearing is set for October 10, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. Notices and advertisements are forthcoming. Zoning Officer Dean Shultz would like attorney Fenicle to represent the township at the hearing. Four variances are requested. Matt said to Dean I thought there would only be one? Dean also recommended that, if approved, a flag flies on the lighted tower top and also to replace the flag if it becomes damaged. (on a regular basis) Allen Beckett stated he would like Linus at the hearing. Linus agreed to attend the hearing.

Waste Contract-Allen Beckett will attend the opening of the Waste Contract Bids on Wednesday September 18, 2013 at the Courthouse.

Comments from Supervisors-None

Joyce reminded the Supervisors that the Township Meeting in November is the first Wednesday, November 6, 2013. The annual Township Convention will be held on the second Wednesday at the Hampton Fire Company, 5371 Carlisle Pike, New Oxford, Pa 17320. The dinner begins at 6.15, followed by the two hour meeting. Reservations need to be made and a head count prior to the meeting October 9, 2013.

Comments from Public- Brenda Snyder ask what will happen if Greenmount Fire Company no longer operates. The Board stated that they have to make arrangements with other fire companies for fire protection, from either Barlow or Fairfield or both. The boxes would have to be changed for this protection. It is the township responsibility to provide the protection.

No further comments the Board adjourned. 3-0

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting October 9, 2013 at the township building. All supervisors, Matt Young, Allen Beckett and Dan Golliday were present, as well as Secretary Joyce Shindledecker. Also present were Liberty Chief Matt Harvey, Solicitor Linus Fenicle, Tax Collector Brenda Snyder, Constable Daniel Ohler, Greenmount Fire Chief Brad Poland, and Road Superintendent Edward Wenschhof. Public in attendance were Tom Wolf, Sherrin Poland, Darlene Stone and Times reporter Beth Kanagy.

Chairman Matt Young brought the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the minutes of the September 11, 2013 meeting. 3-0

Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to accept the financial report with a change from \$260.00 on interest to \$2.60. 3-0

Public Comment-None

Police Report-Chief Matt read the report:
Freedom Patrol 63.5 hrs, Freedom On call 345.75 hrs, Freedom incidents 26 hrs, Freedom Patrol checks 183, Vehicle stopped 10, Traffic Citations 9, Warning Notices 4, Call Outs 3, Details 29 Hours, on details 17hrs, Violations 12. There were no summary, misdemeanor or felony arrests for the month. A full report is available with the township.

Police Contract 2014-2016-Solicitor Linus Fenicle reviewed the 2014-2016 police contract with Liberty Township. He saw no changes except the 3% increase fees for each of the next three years. There is the option of each year by September 30 to end the contract. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to accept the contract. 3-0

Road Report-Joyce read Ed's report for the month-Ed and Mike did mowing, string trimming and brush cutting, and limb trimming along the township roadways. Mike picked up trash and mowed the township lot. Ed met with Gary Tipton (Penn Dot rep) to look at the finished projects on Boyle and Middle Creek Roads. Ed had Mills Communication rep. install an antenna on the 2013 Intl' truck for the radio. Ed had a load of salt delivered from Intl salt for winter maintenance. There was maintenance work done on the tractor and in the building for emergency lights in the hallway. They replaced curve signs on Knorr Road and some culvert markers on Boyle Road. There was a total of 126 hours for the month. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the road report. 3-0

Stone Bid 2013-2014 Joyce had advertised various aggregate for the next year Oct 2013-2014. Valley Quarries was the lone bidder. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to award the bid to Valley Quarries. 3-0

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Fire Company Report-Brad Poland gave the fire Company report for the month of September. There were 9 calls, 5 in Cumberland Township, 3 in Frederick Md and 1 in Freedom Township. Brad commented to the Board that he had heard that at a previous meeting the Supervisors and public were told that the doors may close at Greenmount Fire Company. He also had heard that if and when they did that the Supervisors would call Fairfield and Barlow to take over the area of Greenmount boxes. Brad told that Board that Fairfield is having trouble as well as Greenmount in recruiting members for fire calls. He reminded the Board that a year or so ago Barlow had come to Greenmount to merge, that Greenmount had not gone to them. He stated that the doors would not close, but the Fire Company was in need of the funds that he thought had been budgeted from the tax increase of 2012.

Matt Young explained that the tax increase did happen, but it was illegal to give those funds to the fire company. Brad commented on the 30 page document, COG figures. He was unaware that Freedom had opted out of the COG (Council of Governments). Matt asked for the fire tax figures for Greenmount the COG had figured. Freedom \$26,071 and Cumberland \$14,634 were the figures Brad read from the document.

Comments from Dan Golliday and Allen Beckett at the meeting were that at the recent meetings they had asked for a plan, a five year plan. That they were ready to help out with the mortgage, but were still waiting for the plan. They emphasized that at a previous meeting they had suggested getting help from outside personnel to prepare this 5 year plan. Allen stated that he had given suggestions to Brad, but Brad seemed uninterested for the help.

There was mention that citizens perhaps did not become recruits because of the way the Fire Company was run, that who was in charge may be the problem. Brad stated that if that is the case he will step down. "I will watch. I will give up my keys tonight." Dan Golliday stated that no one has more respect for the Fire Company, the commitment that Brad and his wife do. (then Dan) You do a great job.

Brad stated that he had been a volunteer fireman for 29 years. He had joined the fire company because he wanted to give to the community. But now it is more than that, it is holding social functions, constantly selling tickets, doing, dishes, cleaning the fire company after the events, selling bowls -he is basically sick of these things.

Darlene Stone asked how many members-Brad stated 9 who do everything the fundraisers, run the fire calls-- 9 people for 4 pieces of equipment. But he added there are 60 actual members--most of them lifetime members whom he never sees. They never come to a meeting. Brad did extend the invitation to the Board for their monthly meeting with the next one on Monday, Oct 14, 2013.

The comments went on for 45 minutes back and forth Brad, Allen and Dan. Brad stated he will bring a plan-- they can take (the plan) add to it, change it.

Allen added that even with the Township giving additional money (up from the \$2,250.00 past donations per years), this will be for training etc. social functions will not be replaced by their donations. He knows of no volunteer fire company that does not do these needed fundraisers.

Brad stated that they get money for training from the Volunteer Fire Relief Associations The check for 7765.55, which is written this month.

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Daniel Ohler, a member of the volunteer fire company stated that he has been working on his own plan, had not mentioned this to Brad. He stated he also wants to further his education and get CPR certified, that this costs 500.00
The Board encouraged submission of the plan.
There was no motion to give funds to the fire company.

Secretary report-

Blue/Gray reenactment-Just this evening Joyce had received an email from Mark Way -stating he will mail a check for \$7,252.78 and to the school district (who have not received any funds to date) a check for \$17,893.28. He asked that the township keep the \$3000.00 bond and \$770.50 (credit) that was paid toward solicitor and engineer fees to offset money owed. They had previously paid \$6870.00 in amusement tax to the township. The Board was satisfied with this statement.

Waste Contract-Allen had attended the opening of the bids and the 4 townships/ Fairfield Borough and Carroll Valley had voted on **Parks Garbage**. The rate was the cheapest. The contract will be for the next 3 years with a fourth year option.

Planning Commission Meeting November 6, 2013 7:00 p.m. Dodson subdivision Followed at 8:00, by regular Supervisors meeting. Noted: There will be no meeting on November 12, 2013.

Supervisor's comments-Dan again gave his support to the volunteer fire company, emergency services and first responders.

Matt thanked those in attendance for coming out.

Randy Phiel spoke of the past reenactments the GAC has held in the township and in other townships. Seven had previously been held in Freedom by the GAC.

Randy anticipates 6-800 re-enactors and 6000 to 8000 visitors per day. He compared that last years 150 was like a Super bowl (this event held in Straban & Cumberland townships) and this years a high school football game. He added that the GAC has used the same vendors for port-a-johns and water for the past 20 years. He stated that Chief Briggs is very familiar with the GAC event in the other townships, as previously their chief. He has been asked if this event is for profit or nonprofit and his answer is depending on rain or not.

He added that the GAC gives back to the community. Last years event is giving \$10,000. for the Sachs Mill Bridge project which is between Cumberland and Freedom Townships. Randy added the event would be also held in Freedom next year.

Jim Fox added that Jon Eline Adams County has approved the plan and Bill Stevenson has signed off on the Medical part.
 Dean will review the plan as stated above prior to the March 12, 2014 Township meeting.

Other Business-Joyce would like to check on an escrow account or possibly changing the reserve account to an escrow account. This would mean leaving a balance in the escrow account-whatever the bank requires. Joyce Beckett, auditor for the township recommends this account as it would be a clearer accounting system for bills from the Solicitor and Engineers offices coming in and going out. Joyce reminded both that bills need to be billed separately and on a monthly basis from the engineer rather than only twice a year.


