

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting, Monday January 5, 2009 immediately following their reorganizational meeting. All supervisors were present as well as Secretary Joyce Shindledecker, Road Superintendent, Edward Wenschhof, Emergency Management Coordinator Don Wills and the public Charles Shindledecker, Tom Wolf and Esther Langley.

Reappointed Chairman Matt Young brought the meeting to order.

Vice Chairman Paul Kellett made a motion to approve the December 10, 2008 minutes with a second by Greg Yohe. 3-0

Paul Kellett made a motion to approve the financial statement with a second to the motion by Matt Young. 3-0

Comments from public-None

Police Report. No one was present from Liberty to give the report. Liberty Township supervisors also hold their reorganizational meeting as all does on the first Monday of the New Year.

Joyce Shindledecker had received the police contract for 2009 with no changes. Matt Young made a motion to approve the contract with a second to the motion by Paul Kellett. 3-0

The cost for the Liberty police is 40,000 per year with 20 hours per week and 80 hours "on call" per week.

Road Report- Ed Wenschhof submitted the road report for December. Ed and Mike spread salt and antiskid on roadways on December 16 and 23. They took down a tree leaning across Dawn road on the electric wires. They cleared culverts on McGlaughlin Road and checked township roads for debris after wind and rain.

They repaired lights on the international truck and bought kerosene for the shop heater. The hours for the month were 31. Matt Young made the motion to approve the road report with a second by Greg Yohe. 3-0

Secretary Report-

Hallowed Ground Sign Ordinance- Matt Young made a motion to approve the ordinance 1-5-2009 advertised by solicitor Linus Fenicle on December 10, 2008. Paul Kellett made a second to the motion. 3-0

Pennsylvania Byway Resolution-Matt Young made a motion with a second by Paul Kellett to approve the resolution. Paul Kellett had reservations about the resolution stating he did not like the organization Hallowed Ground telling the township what to do. The resolution passed 3-0

SPCA-Joyce stated she had been contacted by Lisa Conklin of the SPCA with a new total for the township at .50 per resident. She was not sure if it were 325 or 350. The Supervisors will revisit the matter at the February 11, 2009 meeting with actual figures.

Joyce had no other business on the agenda. The next meeting will be February 11, 2009.

Comments from Supervisors-Paul stated (to Greg) that at the last meeting the supervisors had joined a peer to peer committee. The first meeting was in late December and he had the flu so he had nothing to report. Matt Young asked Tom Wolf, liaison for Mason Dixon Country Club, Inc., if he had heard anything on the DEP hearing. Paul thanked everyone for coming out.

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on February 11, 2009. All supervisors and Secretary were present. Public in attendance were Charles Shindledecker, Esther Langley, Tom Wolf, Matt Harvey, and Times reporter, Scot Pitzer.

Chairman Matt Young called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Paul Kellett made a motion to approve the minutes of the reorganizational meeting and regular meeting held January 5, 2009. Greg Yohe made a second to the motion. 3-0

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Paul Kellett to approve the financial report as submitted. 3-0

Comment from public-None

Police Report-Matt Harvey, liberty Police Chief gave the following report

Road Report-Joyce Shindledecker read the report submitted by Edward Wenschhof.
Most of our hours for January were for plowing (snow) and spreading antiskid material
on roads, and clearing limbs and trees brought down because of ice.
(We) had two loads of antiskid delivered from Valley Quarries of Fairfield. (We) had a
load of salt delivered from American Rock Salt co. (We) had the front tire on Dodge
Truck replaced at Quality Tire in Emmetsburg., Md. There were a total of 81 hours for
the month. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Greg Yohe to accept the Road
Report. 3-0

Secretary Report-
SPCA request-Joyce Shindledecker asked the Board to revisit the SPCA's request for
.50 per person which totaled to \$326.00-for only residents over 18. The township has
given 100.00 donations in past years. She had requested a report from Lisa Conklin on
the number of times used the past year. Lisa forwarded the past few months that were
computerized. There were 3 in October, and one humane complaint and one stray animal
control complaint. Paul Kellett made a motion to increase the donation to the SPCA's
request of 326.00. The motion died due to a lack of second.

Agricultural Security Addition-Joyce stated that she had received an ASA application
from Christine Arentz, 130 Bigham Road, Gettysburg Pa a little over 99 acres. Joyce
stated that the opening of the process would have to be advertised. She asked if the
Board would like an advertisement somewhere else in the Times so other landowners
could apply if they wanted to. Response No
Joyce stated the whole process would take between 90-120 days, but no longer than 180
days. A hearing will be held in either May or June.

Act 537 fee schedule-Gettysburg Engineering the Sewage Enforcement office submitted a fee schedule for 2009. She stated there were no changes. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Paul Kellett to approve the schedule to be forwarded to DEP. 3-0

Gettysburg Anniversary Reenactment-The GA Committee has submitted its plan for July 3-5, 2009 to be held on the Shields Farm. Dean Shultz of Gettysburg Engineering has reviewed the plan and submitted 13 comments. The Committee representative was not at the meeting so the comments will be forwarded to them to comply with. No comments were made by the Supervisors except Paul stated they were minimal.

Emergency Management Wage-Matt Young made a motion with a second by Paul Kellett to raise the hourly rate (if an incident occurs) from 11.60 to 14.60 an hour to join in Hamiltonhan's raise given to our coordinator Don Wills. Wills works for both townships.

Joyce stated that the Planning Commission would hold a meeting on March 4, 2009 to review the David Redgrave subdivision. The next township meeting is on March 11, 2009.

Comments from Supervisors-

Joint Southwestern Comprehensive Plan -Matt stated that a public meeting was held on the JSWCP and he has posted maps from the meeting. Freedom along with 5 other townships/ boro is discussing a possible joint plan. The meetings are informational; this does not suggest that Freedom will make any changes.

Comments from Public-Tom Wolf asked the Supervisors to consider again the .50 per person for the SPCA. He asked that if not the whole amount would they compromise on something between the 100-326. Joyce stated that in order to have the SPCA services the township is required to give the whole 326.00. She asked Tom would you be willing to make a donation. Tom responded without hesitation that he would give 1/3 of the 226.00 needed to make the difference. Supervisors Paul Kellett volunteered to make up the 2/3 - 151.00 difference.

Paul Kellett made a motion to donate to the SPCA the amount of 326.00 with 100.00 coming out of township funds. Young made a second to the motion. 3-0

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on March 11, 2009 at the township building, 2184 Pumping station road, Fairfield, Pa. All Supervisors were present. Secretary Joyce Shindedecker was also present. Public in attendance were Tom Wolf, Matt Harvey, Charles Shindedecker, Ed Wenschhof, Nancy Bushey, Ed Buchheit, Norma Calhoun, Wayne Belt, and Carol Zegarskin.

Chairman Matt Young called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Paul Kellett made a motion with a second by Greg Yohe to approve the minutes of the February 11, 2009 meeting. 3-0

Paul Kellett made a motion with a second by Greg Yohe to approve the financial statement for the period February 1-28, 2009, 3-0

No Public Comment

Police Report-Matt Harvey gave the police report for the month. There was a total of 240 hours for the month with 2311 miles driven. There were 50 routine patrol hours for Freedom. There were 377 on call hours. There were 114 patrol checks. There were 31 vehicles stopped with 27 citations given and 9 warning notices. There were 4 traffic accidents, one resulting in death. There were 9 traffic details. A full report is available through Liberty Township or on file at the Freedom Township office by appointment.

Road Report-Joyce read the following Road Report submitted by Ed Wenschhof
A tree was cleared off McGlaughlin Road, replaced Street Signs on Camp Gettysburg Roads. They picked up trash along township roadways. There was brush trimming along Boyle Road. One load of antiskid was delivered and then mixed with salt. The roads were checked and cleared of any debris after high winds. There was a total of 46 hours labor for the month. Matt made a motion with a second by Greg to approve the road report. 3-0

Secretary Report-The Gettysburg Anniversary Committee have reviewed Dean's comments and have given answer to them by email to the township secretary. Matt Young made a motion to give conditional approval to the event upon all items of Dean's letter of recommendation being met. Greg Yohe made a second to the motion 3-0.

American Odyssey Relay-Joyce had been contacted by the American Odyssey on a relay event. The question she has was if the township needs to be named on the insurance policy. Paul stated that that would not be necessary as they will not be using any part of the township lot for anything. Police Chief Matt Harvey stated he had talked to the event organizers and there would only be one person running at a time in the relay. The event begins on April 24, 2009 at the Gateway Center of Gettysburg. They will in Freedom Township on Bullfrog to Pumping Station to Red Rock back to Camp Gettysburg Road to McGlaughlin Rd then to Liberty Hall in Liberty Township.

David Redgrave 2 lot subdivision. Joyce turned over to Supervisors. Matt Young stated that the plan had been submitted on an old subdivision plan submitted by Redgrave in 2006. There had been sketches in changes not done by Riley J Redding or any other engineering firm. Riley Redding response to this was that it was unethical. Also the plan must be signed and dated by the engineering firm. The Freedom Township Planning Board had reviewed the plan and recommend the plan be denied per advise from the township solicitor to the following wording.

The denial reads as: Section 304-A-3 and section 304-A-8 of the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance requires that the Preliminary Plan show the name, address, license number and scale of the Professional Engineer or Registered Surveyor who prepared the drawings and show a certification by the Professional Engineer or Registered Surveyor that the Plan is accurate and correct and has been prepared in accordance with the Professional Engineers Registration Law. Pursuant to the letter of February 23, 2009, to the applicant from J. Riley Redding, PLS, of Adams County Surveyors, the Preliminary Plan dated 2006 of David J. Redgrave does not have the seal and certification of J. Riley Redding, since it was not prepared by J. Riley Redding. The Preliminary Plan was submitted and was held out to the Township that it was prepared and certified by J. Riley Redding and the said Plan was not, accordingly, the plan application is rejected and the plan is also denied. Paul Kellett made a motion to deny the plan on the same basis with a second to the motion by Matt Young. 3-0 **Plan denied.**

Joyce stated she had received an email from Bicky Redman who would like to plan a meeting with the **waste haulers** regarding the upcoming **contract renewals**. She gave the board the information. Paul Kellett stated that he would attend the meetings and any time and date would be fine with him. Joyce will pass the information along to Bicky.

Joyce had received documentation from **FEMA** on the new **flood plain maps**. Two parcels in the township have changed status. According to the letter it is up to the township to notify the property owners. Joyce will do so.

Joyce stated that the Planning Commission would meet on April 1, 2009 to review a subdivision submitted by Robert Bishop. The next Supervisors meeting will be April 8, 2009.

Comments from Supervisors. Paul thanked everyone for coming out.

Comments from public-Wayne Belt asked Paul to bring up the trash haulers littering on the roadway when trash is picked up. Gettysburg Anniversary Committee-Joyce reported that the Committee had made application for the reenactment to be held on July 3-5 at the former Yingling farm, now owned by Timothy Shields and the Shroeder family. After speaking with Dean Shultz who reviewed the plan documents the only missing items were confirmation from the fire company who will be at the site and from the second water company providing backup water for the event. James Fox reported he had documentation from the Fire Company. Other items to be addressed are the insurance policy and pyrotechnics policy. These will be done approximately 30 days prior to the event and must be reviewed by solicitor Linus Fenicle. Also Joyce stated that there was questions made of the tickets sales. Joyce added that the township has always accepted the committees reports and do not question admissions. The 3,000 bond must also be paid. Event organizer, Randy Phiel, stated the bond would be paid by check tonight. He also gave an over view of the scheduled event. Waste Contracts 2010-Bicky Redman has begun the process for updating the contracts with municipalities and waste collection companies. Hamiltonban secretary has asked the other 5 Southwest Group, Carroll Valley, Fairfield Borough, Freedom, Hamiltonban, Highland and Liberty who now have IESI if the contract sent to the township looked O.k. Reenactment Liability Insurance-Joyce received word from Linus Fenicle that he had reviewed the insurance policy submitted to the township for the 146 reenactment on July 3-5, 2009. Linus has given approval of the policy.

Police Chief Matt Harvey gave the road report. The total hours worked by Liberty Police were 228.5. There were 2389 miles driven. 63.25 Hours were patrolled in Freedom Township. Freedom Township incidents were 28. There were 18 vehicles stopped and 11 traffic citations given. There were 16 warning notices given. There was one summary arrest. There was one traffic accident and one domestic family incident. There were 9 police assists and one Fire EMS assist. Chief Harvey gave a full report break down of all incidents. The report is available per request

Road Report-Joyce read the report submitted by Ed Wenschhof. There were 171 hours of labor for the month consisting of mowing and string trimming along township roads and the township lot. Paul made the statement that all stones should be delivered to the sites.

Waste Contract 2010-Bicky Redman had forwarded a revised contract for the Southwestern Municipalities. Matt Young made a motion with a second that he is satisfied with the revisions to put out for bid, but to include commercial dumpsters for Freedom Township. 3-0

Joyce also stated that an ordinance had been advertised for the COG. There would be adoption at the August meeting.

Comments from Public-Don Wills stated that there is a new Secretary for Hamiltonban Township Debra Feiler.
He also stated he had attended an all day seminar at County Control on PE/MA. There was new hazmat material on a CD there is also a new hazardous material site. The Gettysburg Water Company located in Cumberland Township. Since it is close to Freedom we need to add it to our information. The only other are the Gas Company. The Fireworks building does not fall under Hazardous Material. They have a sprinkler system.
He also stated there is a NIMS 800, 802,803

Matt Harvey stated that a course was given by a Baltimore Company and held at the Fairfield School District. This is the first in the county. The course was started by LIU. Everyone gathered to discuss how the schools will be mapped out with reflected numbers on the doors, in case of an incident. Everyone would have the plans. This way all departments can help out and the policy will be the same across the county. He started now that this is started in Adams County more Counties will follow.

Comment from Supervisors- COG Council of Governments-during the last meeting Paul stated that the subject was brought up on the opt in for UCC that an appeals Board must be in place. Joyce stated she was under the impression, as was Matt Young, that an appeals Board was begun when we opted in the UCC (Uniform Construction Code) with MDIA. (Middle Department Inspection Agency). Secretary Report-

Vernon Judy Final subdivision-
Joyce presented the Final Plan of Vernon Judy to convey footage off his lot onto Jim Valente's parcel of land along McGlaughlin Road. The preliminary planned had been given the go ahead despite unfavored comments by Gettysburg Engineering. The Township solicitor Linus Fenicle agreed with Gettysburg Engineers remarks on this changing of density. But in turn stated in his letter that it was the Supervisors' decision

and he would adhere to their approval. Paul Kellett made a motion to approve the plan with a second by Matt Young. Paul Kellett made the motion with a second by Matt Young to forward the Request for Planning Waiving and Non-building Declaration to DEP. 3-0
Joyce stated that the Mr. Valente has the go ahead to have the mylars drawn up for signatures and recording at the Adams County Court House.

Robert Bishop 12 acre lot subdivision Final Plan-

Joyce presented the Final Plan submitted by Robert Bishop of a 12 acre parcel with an existing house and out buildings. There was discussion on the unrecorded option agreement regarding a 25 ft (or wider) right-a-way note added to the plan. Paul Kellett had a problem with the or wider. Even though the agreement is unrecorded, Mason Dixon Country Club must be informed that the right away must be the same as on the plan. Benn Bishop stated he had not previously seen the final plan drawn up by the Surveyor. He would have the plan and mylar changed. Benn exited the meeting. Joyce asked the status of the plan. Paul suggested Joyce notify Benn that the plan must be brought to the township for review no later than Nov 12 or the plan will be rejected.

Harold Deed sketch Plan-

Harold Deed brought a sketch plan to the Planning Board on Tuesday Oct 13 and the Board suggested that the plan be reviewed by Liberty Township, but they could present to this Board if they wished. Thee Deeds own an 8 acre tract (with existing house) in Liberty Township and 20 acres adjacent in Freedom Township. The 20 acres has no road frontage in Freedom. The Deed's want to evenly divide the 20 acres to their two daughters. They are willing to give each lot an access driveway off their property in Liberty (to the two lots in Freedom). Gettysburg Engineering's Dean Shultz stated that panhandle lots are not favored in Freedom Township. After discussion back and forth, the Board stated that this would not be a panhandle issue but an issue to whether Liberty would give permission to create the driveways. As far as Freedom the two lots meet the requirements of acreage for the Rural Conservation District. The Deed's plan goes before Liberty's Board of Supervisors later in the month.

Randy Naill/Chris Restak-

Chris Restak, solicitor for Randy Naill asked to take a few minutes to discuss a situation on Natural Dam Road. Randy Naill and his wife Amy have acquired land from a relative. The land is the former Cullison residence at the end of Natural Dam Road. The Natural Dam Bridge below their property was washed out in 1996. The Board has met with Mr. Naill earlier in the year and there was discussion of a turn around. (The township employees were having a hard time turning their truck when plowing snow on the road at this end.) Mr. Naill had begun construction of a building which is into the township right-a-way. Mr. Shultz, permit officer and Zoning officer had ceased the construction of the building. There has been no permit application and no permit written to construct the building. This was not the subject of discussion tonight.

Mr. Restak, on behave of Randy Naill, was there to ask the Supervisors their opinion on the possibly of Mr. Naill paying for a turn around with the understanding that that portion of the Natural Dam Road be vacated by the Township. The radius needed would be 40 ft and this would encroach on the adjoining neighbor, Mr. Nail's brother-in-law. Mr. Restak also stated that the County had no plans of rebuilding the Bridge. Mr. Shultz agreed that was the County's view not replacing the bridge. Matt Young stated he was not sure he would want to vacate the road. He suggested that the township possibly put a turn around on the side where the bridge had been located. This would be at the township's expense, much cheaper than Naill's proposed which is anticipated at \$50, 000.

Also there was advice from the township solicitor that in order to vacate a road a public hearing would have to be held. He also stated that an agreement would have to be written up between Naill and the Supervisors. Matt asked about the other residents using the upper portion of the roadway (traveling to their homes). Linus suggested that letters could be sent out to all residents to attend a meeting to explain what is being proposed for their input. Greg Yohe stated that he would like to see a preliminary plan before any decisions were made. He stated that like everyone else a plan is necessary to see in print what Mr. Naill is proposing. The discussion was left at that point.

Budget Meeting- Joyce asked the Supervisors if they would like to have a budget meeting. A meeting was set for Thursday Oct 29, 2009 at 7:00 p.m at the township building. The solicitor advised that the meeting be advertised.

Preservation/Christine Arentz 99.5 acres- Joyce had received a letter from the Land Conservancy. The Land Conservancy is asking Freedom's support in writing as they are applying for a grant from the Green Space Program for funding to purchase a conservation easement on the Arentz property on Bigham Road which would permanently preserve the property. Joyce had written the letter and asked the Supervisors of their support. Paul Kellett made a motion with a second by Greg Yohe to approve the forwarding of the letter in support of this project. 3-0

Supervisor's comments-Paul is the representative on the Peer to Peer committee. The cost to join this is a little more than anticipated so Paul will be discussing this at the budget workshop.

Also as representative to the Bidding on the waste hauling contract he advises they are now out for bids. As far as the South Western Comprehensive Plan- Rob Thacler would like specific goals and objectives for Freedom Township. He will let the committee proceed on that one. (Freedom's representatives attend the meetings to learn of the other participants' plans but are not committing to any changes in the township.)

Adams County Earned Income-

Greg Yohe attended the meeting on the Adams County Earned Income tax. Each township had a weighted vote Freedom's was .4. As the vote is based on the population and the tax base; of which ours is very small. But we were a part of the vote. The Pa

Governor has passed the bill that all Boroughs and Municipalities use the same agency in order to avoid confusion as of where to pay the tax. This committee was formed to put together a proposal in order to decide which agency will be the collector.

Roof Bid-Matt Young stated that Ed had clarified the bid selected for the roof. Matt made a motion with a second by Paul to have the township roof replaced. The cost will be 5045. to the township. Matt asked Ed to have the builder check the lathes out to make sure they are none rotted. 3-0
Ed had gotten three quotes as required for the bidding. This was the lowest bid.

Truck-Matt mentioned that on the truck issue he is looking for a new truck. If anyone can find a used truck ?? His opinion is a used truck will cost in the long run (for repairs and upkeep, etc) as much as a new one.

CDL certified-

Matt also stated he completed the course and is now CDL certified. He oversees the drug testing that is required by the state at random draws. Ed had been drawn every year for the test. Matt certification replaces Sam Brewer's who held the position when employed by the township.

Whatever is done must meet the requirements (by Penn Dot) on his property or something has to be worked out (with the neighbor). There will be no eminent domain regarding the neighbor's (property). Matt did state that they probably would not need 80 feet, possibly 60 feet.
Paul states that he cannot see vacating the road. He would rather see a turn around at the site near the (fallen) bridge.
Matt stated that if Penn Dot grants a waiver of 50-60 ft that would be plenty. He stated that he was not inclined to spend a lot of time thinking about this property. He stated that the building (started without a permit) was in line with the turn around. He stated that there has been a shift in the floodplain.
Again the Board noted that the top of the property will have to be worked out (with whomever, neighbor)

Freedom Township minutes February 17, 2010

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on February 17, 2010. The meeting was advertised due to the cancellation of Feb 10, 2010 for weather related conditions. They cleared a fallen tree from Natural Dam Road. They also did some minor maintenance work on the trucks and plow. Total hours 251. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the road report. 3-0

Secretary Report-Emergency Management-Joyce stated a letter was received from Deputy Emergency Coordinator Larry Schneider noting his resignation. (Effective April 2, 2010) Matt asked Don Wills if he would be replacing him. Don stated that no one had wanted the job. (that he had asked). Don stated he is 73 years old. Don added that he had updated the files for the Emergency Operations Center. He also gave out paper work to each Supervisor and Joyce Shindledecker with their duties if a disaster occurs. Paul Kellett duties are similar to the duties of Larry Schneider. Don also gave a copy of the Operations plan on disc to Joyce to store away from the township building.

Philip Neth subdivision- Joyce stated that Cumberland Township forwarded the letter of withdrawal of the subdivision submitted last fall. Therefore the subdivision is also withdrawn in Freedom as it was one.

Ted and Teresa Locker subdivision—Highland Township Supervisors had approved the subdivision at their March 9, 2010 meeting. Joyce asked for a motion to forward the paperwork to DEP for the non-building waiver. Paul Kellett made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett. 3-0

Brad Poland Fire Chief Police-Brad Poland explained the line up when a fire call is dispatched. They are one paid crew and one volunteer crew at Gettysburg, Emmitsburg and Fairfield ambulances. Normally the volunteer ambulances are second responders. Brad explained the process of a box card submitted to 911 dispatchers at the beginning of the year. With only a few and sometimes none on the volunteer crew, he is asking for permission to change the box card to have the second ambulance be a paid crew. Matt asked Don Wills of his advice? Don stated he is a resource man and cannot tell Brad what to do. He supports the changes. Dominic Bonitatis, member of the Greenmount Fire Company gave his support for the Fire Company and what it wants to do. Brad stated that if the Supervisors want to think about the changes, that is OK. Paul Kellett made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the submission of box card changes as Greenmount Fire Company requests to 911. 3-0

Gloryridge addition of 17 cabins-Last month Gloryridge's attorney, Bernard Yanetti asked for two variances; one from a zoning hearing and one from a land development plan. The draft plan of Jack Powell was forwarded to zoning officer, Dean Shultz at the Supervisors request. After Dean's review, Dean made the decision as zoning officer that a zoning hearing must be held. Also as zoning officer, he advised that a Land Development Plan must be reviewed by the Freedom Township Planning Board and the Freedom Township Board of Supervisors. Mr. Powell has submitted application and a \$300. check to the zoning hearing board. A date will be released as soon as Joyce coordinates schedules of James Yingst zoning solicitor, Dean Shultz and the Zoning Hearing Board whom consists of Bradley Yohe, William Arentz Jr. and J. Dan Golliday. (Note- date has been set for April 5, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. at the township building.) Residents adjacent will be notified and sign(s) will post the property. John White, township solicitor, asked about whose duties these were. Joyce stated that James Yingst writes up the advertisement, she advertises, disburses the

letters and her husband Charlie posts the signs. This has been working since 1996 when zoning first started in the township.

York/Adams Tax Collection Agency Appointment-Under new law, the Adams County Commissioners and local municipalities, boros and school district have voted to obtain once again York/Adams to collect the local tax for the Adams County area. This will begin in 2012. This is no change for Freedom Residents since we voted to stay with York/Adams in 2008.

Comments from Supervisors-

Peer-to-peer-Paul Kellett attended the peer-to-peer meeting. This was sponsored by Cumberland Township. If the local municipalities can meet the deadline in committing to give funds to the local recreation park, the State will match the funds of up to 125,000. The amount of the donation is .50 per resident the first year 1.00, 2nd 1.50, 3rd 2.00, fourth and 2.50 the fifth year. The motion was tabled until next month. As Matt had not seen the documentation, Paul will drop it off. Joyce requested a copy for the township from Paul.

Vacancy Board-Paul asked about the legality of the vacancy board office being held by a township employee. Ed Wenschhof had been a reoccurring volunteer to seat the vacancy Board each January reorganizational meeting.

Ed has never had to exercise this duty. Paul asked solicitor White if he would check into the matter. Also Paul states that within the bylaws the vacancy board must meet at the beginning of the year with the Board of Supervisors. There has been speculation, in the past from Board members of what the actual duties of this Board are to be used in reference with. Anytime there was a question of use, Joyce had referred the question to former solicitor Linus Fenicle for his legal position on the question.

Randy Naille-Matt asked Joyce to give Dean a call and see what is next as far as the State meeting with the township at the location.

Calls to township Solicitor- John White has received a few calls from residents with township business questions. Matt and the Board instructed John that the township will not be billed for any resident calls.

Paul thanked everyone for coming out.

Comments from Public-

Mason Dixon Country Club, Inc-Tom Wolf asked Solicitor White if he would join in on a meeting with Supervisor Allen Beckett to bring them up to speed on Mason Dixon Country Club. According to Tom, DEP has given a draft approval of the withdrawal of water from Middle Creek. The DEP hearing was held at the Greenmount Fire Company several years ago. MDCC has been working with DEP since then on various requests from DEP. John White agreed to meeting with MDCC off the clock. Motion by Matt with second by Allen -adjourned 3-0

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on April 14, 2010. All Supervisors were present as well as Secretary, Joyce Shindledecker. Public in attendance were Emergency Management Coordinator, Don Wills, Liberty Police officer, Andy Hansen, Road superintendent, Ed Wenschhof, Herbert Mulligan, Greenmount Fire Chief Deputy, Tom wolf, Mary Buchheit, and Joe Buchheit.

Matt Young, Chairman called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Paul Kellett made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the March 10, 2010 minutes as submitted by the secretary. 3-0

Comments from public-None

Police Report-Andy Hansen, Liberty police gave the report-Total hours worked 311.5, miles driven 3188, Freedom Township patrol 70 hours. Response to e-mail on Traffic Study-Dan Thorton is currently working on the traffic impact study for the proposed Cumberland Township Casino at the All Star Family Fun property. Kellett stated the Supervisors are concerned with the study of the Emmitsburg Road intersections with Us Route 15. He said when he received the email he immediately thought of Tom Wolf and the 2005 traffic study for the proposed Mason Dixon Country Club, Inc development. Tom Wolf stated that they (MDCC) would be willing to share their information.

Gloryridge Request for a Waiver of submitting a Subdivision Land Development Plan-

Jack Powell, engineer for Gloryridge Campground sent via an email May 10, 2010 a request for the above waiver. In his letter he states that due to the extensive review that has been conducted by the Twp Zoning Officer and Zoning Hearing Board, the approval of the requested special exception and in accordance with the previously submitted backup documentation, we hereby request a waiver from the Townships LD review process.

In the letter he states he will provide adequate design plans for all the proposed facilities where needed for Building Permits
Provide the Twp with Record drawing of all buildings, internal access ways, utilities and Site improvement

Provide the twp with copies of all required state and local permits obtained as required to perform the needed expansion work

And as the sole party involved, Gloryridge at Gettysburg, LLC, Accepts any defects or damages which may occur or come to light based upon approval of this Waiver Request and as such shall hold the township harmless.

Jack Powell stated that the Township Zoning Officer and Township Zoning Hearing Board had been supplied with a Use Plan and a narrative outlining the proposed expansion, the same one supplied to the Supervisors at their February 17, 2010 meeting. Prior to submission of the and during the Zoning Hearing Board, Powell stated the Site's water, wastewater, and storm water systems were reviewed, discussed, and deemed adequate for the existing facilities and proposed expansion.

Powell stated that he did not need an NDPS permit (the property being developed under 5 acres) and there is an ENS planned.

He stated the property is sole ownership of Gloryridge and unlike other subdivisions will not be parceled and sold to other people.

Powell stated they are not requesting any design waivers.

Kellett stated the SDLD review by the Planning Commission, AC Planning Commission recommendations and the Supervisors review is to see that all requirements have been met.

Powell-They (ZHB) says we met them
Kellett-states that any recommendations by County Planning according to the ZH Boards' decision E. All improvement, existing or proposed, shall be situated

approximately as set forth on the Use Plan submitted by the applicant at the hearing of this matter. Anything greater than a de minimis deviation therefrom shall require re-submission of the proposal to the Board as a change to the request for a special exception.

Kellett states that any change would kick out the approved Special Exception and they (Gloryridge) would have to start all over with a submission.

Kellett asked what purpose it would be for the other Boards to review the Plan.

Powell-there is nothing else to review.

Joyce stated that on page 8 of the Zoning Hearing Decision item N reads occupancy of the site as a campground shall not be permitted until the Applicant has obtained from the Board of Supervisors of a land development plan pursuant to the Township subdivision and Land Development Ordinance, as well as approval of an erosion and sediment control plan in accordance with all applicable Township and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania laws, ordinance and regulations.

Norma Calhoun- the review process in the township, the plan goes to the Zoning Hearing Board then the Planning Comm, and County Planning, then to the Supervisors for review.

The LDS is not a special exception.

Beckett-We are here to uphold the health welfare and the safety (of the residents)

Kellett-The AC Planning and the Planning Commission Board see that everything is in compliance -the Zoning Hearing Board did that. I don't see the reviewing for the sake of reviewing. I don't see the benefit.

Someone stated Dean has reviewed it thoroughly, they are in compliance.

Brad Yohe-this is not a LD Plan submission.

Powell-this is not a sketch plan

Yohe-When we passed the Zoning Hearing Process we wrote it with check and balances to have reviews and proper reviews. There is a procedure to follow. No where (in a zoning hearing) does that replace the review. This is a fast track on a race track No concerns (without the reviews)

Beckett-Health, welfare and safety are our concerns.
Attorney John White asked if there had been a Land Development Plan submitted
