The E. Mac Rhodes subdivision plan was received from the Township Planning Commission. The plan was approved by the Adams County & Freedom Township Planning Commission. The plan was reviewed by the Township Supervisors & on motion of Terry Witzel, seconded by John Hess. The plan was approved by the Supervisors.

A brochure on the "Fairfield Farms" subdivision was presented to the board by Mr. Witzel. The supervisor had no knowledge of such a subdivision. Mr. Witzel reported that a recorded plat on "Fairfield Farms" could not be located in the Courthouse. The pamphlet shows the Owner & Developer as "Wolfe, Marion & Shetler" & J. Richard Keeley as Engineer. The supervisors directed Mr. Witzel to contact the developer & request them to supply us with a recorded plat.

The Preliminary Plan of Section A. Macke Manor Subdivision, owned by R.D. Hoggatt & Associates & drawn by J.R. Keeley, Engineer, was received from the Freedom Twp. Planning Commission. The planning commission reviewed the plan & found numerous deficiencies with the plan (Photo-copy of commission finding attached hereto). The supervisors reviewed the plan & unanimously agreed with the Freedom Twp. planning commission findings & the Board instructed Mr. Witzel to contact the developer's engineer of the plans deficiencies.

No. Witzel had a "Building Permit Ordinance" which was proposed by the State. Mr. Gordon made a motion that the Ordinance be adopted, seconded by Mr. Hess. Mr. Witzel was instructed to advertise the Ordinance to be adopted at our November 13<sup>th</sup> meeting.

A motion was made by Mr. Gordon to appoint Guy Harmer to fill the vacancy of Wadsworth Tolbert on the Township Planning Commission, seconded by Mr. Hess. On Motion of Mr. Gordon, seconded by Mr. Hess, the following resolution was adopted:

A resolution providing for the appointment of a sewer officer required under the

Penna. Sewage Facilities Act "Act 537" & the establishment  
of fees for enforcement of same.

Whereas, the General Assembly by its Act 537 of Jan. 24, 1966 required each  
municipality to appoint an enforcement officer to administer & enforce all rules &  
regulations as pertain to the installation of on-site subsurface sewage disposal  
systems.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Freedom  
Township, Adams Co. Pa. in a regular meeting assembled this 9<sup>th</sup> day of Oct. 1974

Dear Mr. Herr:

The Freedom Township Planning Board has reviewed the preliminary plan of R. D. Haggart and Associates for their subdivision along Middle Creek to be known as Section A, Maske Manor Subdivision. We cannot approve the plan due to the following deficiencies:

1. The name and address of the owner and of the engineer/surveyor do not appear on the plan.
2. No location key map is shown on the plan.
3. Distances and bearings along the boundary lines are not shown.
4. As regards the contour lines - have they been drawn in the field or have they been interpolated from the USGS map? The line designating the floodplain does not follow the natural land contours. When the floodplain line is shown in its proper place, the majority of each lot on the plan lies within a potential flood area. Those of us who have resided in the township for several years have witnessed such flooding at these locations.
5. There are given no Deed Book numbers for adjacent property owners.
6. The street should be continued through the subdivision to prepare for the possible future development of the Gordon property to the east. It must meet state and township specifications and these should be shown on the plan.
7. There are no utility easements shown - are there utilities located in the area being subdivided?
8. The location of a successful completion of a soil profile analysis and soil percolation test must be shown for each lot on the plan, and Act 537 revision requirements must be met and shown.

Thank you for your consideration of our recommendations regarding this plan.

Chief Brughner reported that he answered 6 calls during the month of October, made 1 vehicle accident investigation, made 3 assistance to the public, made 1 house check & spent a total of 20 hours patrolling the township.

Mr. Witzel presented the 1975 Budget to the Board. Mr. Kew made a motion to tentatively adopt the budget. Motion seconded by Mr. Gordon. The budget will be adopted on December 11th. It will be open for inspection at the home of the Secretary.

Mr. Witzel reported that his letter to "Wolfe, State Auditor", in regards to the recorded plat on the "Fairfield Farms", has been unanswered.

Mr. Witzel made a motion that the Township Building Permit Ordinance #9 be approved & adopted. Motion seconded by Mr. Gordon.

Mr. Witzel proposed the following "Flood Insurance Program" resolution:

Whereas, The Board of Supervisors of Freedom Township, Adams Co. being cognizant of the recurring flooding & the threat of flooding of Marsh Creek, Middle Creek, Plum Creek & the resulting damage to property located within the Township, Adams Co. Whereas, there is a desire & need for this program of insurance coverage for those who own or hold title to property located within such flood-prone areas; and Whereas, relief is available in the form of flood insurance as authorized by the Nat'l Flood Ins. Act of 1968, as amended; and Whereas, the regulations promulgated by the Fed. Ins. Administrator under said Act requires: (1) an official legislature is created at initiating a local road for flood insurance and a desire to participate in the Nat'l Flood Ins. Program and (2) insurance and the form of action by the appropriate local legislative body committing the local legislature body to certain future courses of action; and Whereas, the Board of Supervisors of Freedom Twp, Adm. Co. is the appropriate local legislative body as authorized by the Pa. Municipalities Planning Code (P.L. 73-A of 1968) to defend watercourses and to regulate the use of the land by enacting flood regulations. Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Freedom, Adams Co., that Freedom Township hereby authorizes the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Freedom, Adams Co. to take such action as will enable a position entered in survey flood hazard coverage under the National Flood Ins. Program because of a clear danger of flooding and the resulting or related damage to property in the Township of Freedom and, that, it will comply with the regulations of the Nat'l Flood Ins. Program (1) To recognize and duly enforce flood hazards and/or modified hazards & all official actions relating to land use in the areas flood hazards and/or modified hazards. (2) To take such other official actions

as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program. Such actions may include, but will not be limited to: (a) Delimiting or assisting the Administrator, & his agents, in delineation & the limits of the flood plain during special flood hazard and/or request, a map or maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of flood hazard areas or available local map of sufficient scale to identify the location of flood hazard areas - the Administrator may request covering building sites. (b) Providing such information - the Administrator may request covering further occupancy of the flood plain &/or modeled areas. (c) Making arrangements for giving notice or occupancy of the flood plain &/or modeled areas, with respect to each area being special flood hazard, inspection and furnishing, upon request, with respect to each area being special flood hazard, information (to N.D.L. mean sea level) of the lowest floor of all non-residential buildings in the area. (d) Cooperating with Federal, State & local agencies & private firms which undertake to study, survey, map & identify flood plain or modeled areas; as well as cooperate with neighboring municipalities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain or modeled areas & adopt joint resolution of the flooding problem. (3) To appoint a designated Person to be responsible for implementation of the flooding problem. (3) The Board of Directors shall be responsible for the responsibility, authority & means to implement the resolution. P.O. #2, City Island, Pa. with the responsibility, authority & means to implement the resolution. (4) Each year to submit on each anniversary date of the community's adoption, an annual report to the Administrator - the progress made during the past year within the community in the development & implementation of flood plain and/or modeled area management measures.

Mr. Gordon made a motion that this resolution be adopted, seconded by Mr. Kerr.

Mr. Wetzel proposed the following resolution of compliance with Section 1910.32 of the Flood Damage Prevention regulations -

Whereas, the Board of Directors of Treadon has initiated by resolution, - dated 2/2/74 Flood Damage Prevention Program - Whereas, the Board of Directors has agreed to take such official actions as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program. Now, Therefore be it resolved by the Board of Directors of the Township of Treadon, beginning Nov. 19, 1974 shall be the following: 1. Required building permits for all proposed construction or other improvement in the community; 2. Review all building permit applications for new construction or substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a location which has a flood hazard, any proposed new construction or substantial improvement (including prefabricated and mobile homes) must (i) be designed (or modified) and anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure, (ii) use construction materials - utility equipment that are resistant to flood damage, and (iii) use construction methods & practices that will minimize flood damage; 3. Review subdivision proposals & other proposed new developments to assure that (i) all such proposals are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage (ii) all public utilities & facilities, such as sewer, gas, electrical & water systems are located, elevated, & constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage, and (iii) adequate drainage is provided so as to reduce exposure to flood hazards; & 4. Required new or replacement water supply systems and/or sanitary sewage systems to be designed to range a climate infiltration flood waters into the system and discharge from the system to flood sites, & require that waste disposal systems to be located so as to avoid impairment of this or contamination from them during flooding.

Mr. Kerr made a motion that this resolution be adopted, seconded by Mr. Gordon.

The secretary reported approval had been received on road work in 1975 & receipt of the County Aid Legend Fuel money.

The State expenditure report for 1975 & municipal budget for 1976 were approved & signed by the Board.

The Agreement, Contract & expenditure forms for Flood damage were approved & signed. Damage was listed as: \$ 470.66 for Scott Road + \$ 254.31 for Rohrbough Road - total. \$ 724.97.

Mr. Wilbur Redding appeared before the Board to protest a decision made by the Township Sewage Enforcement Officer, Ken Shultz, that a sand mound only could be used for sewage disposal on his lot on Bullfrog Road. He stated he had contacted Mr. Shultz, who came out to the property, looked at it and said a sand mound had to be used. A percolation test also had to be made. He stated he informed Mr. Shultz by telephone of the date for the test but when the final testing was done, Mr. Shultz was not at the site. Mr. Redding completed the test, gave the results to Mr. Shultz who decided the soil was suitable only for a sand mound. Mr. Redding then listed the results of his percolation test and a soil report of tests he had conducted for a system will be approximately

250 gallons a day as he lives alone and property will not spend much time in the tanks even then. It stated that while his soil analysis is not 100% proof, it is fully adequate that the test was done on site and not taken from any other. Mr. Riddings stated he intends to install a conventional system under protest and will then take Mr. Shultz to court to get a sewage permit.

A letter was read from Mr. Shultz to the Board of Supervisors, outlining the reasons for denying a permit for anything but a sand mound, stating the questionable test results had been acceptable but the issuance of a permit is graded on soil suitability, which, in his opinion, is not acceptable for a conventional system at this site.

The supervisors informed Mr. Riddings that they cannot overrule Mr. Shultz' decision and suggested the only thing he could do was to get an independent soil analysis made. Mr. Riddings refused this suggestion by stating a court order would be needed for someone to come onto his property. Mr. Weitzel questioned how anyone could check on the tests if he would not allow further testing to be done and asked Mr. Riddings exactly what his intentions were on this matter. Mr. Riddings stated he does not want to ask the Board to do anything that is illegal and is not going to attempt to do anything not in accordance with the rules and regulations but "I am going to take it to court". Mr. Weitzel then thanked Mr. Riddings for coming to the meeting and expressing his opinion and stated the Supervisors are sorry they can do nothing for him. The Supervisors agreed they are not qualified to make a decision in regards to the type of soils that are acceptable under Act 537.

The motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Mr. Weitzel, seconded by Mr. Herr and carried.

 Attorney Libut Campbell arrived at the meeting with a one-lot subdivision plan (19.8 acres) Haggart Associates wish to sell to Mr. Stephens. Review of the plan & discussion of the on-site inspection of road access was carried out with advice from Atty. Campbell that the plan not be approved at this meeting. Attorney Murray Frey, Jr. & later Mr. Ronald Haggart arrived at the meeting. A lengthy discussion was carried out by the three attorneys, Messrs. Frey & Haggart stating that plot is over ten acres & according to DER regulations is agricultural, it has no access to a state road and a setfatory module prepared for DER & under these circumstances the supervisors have no legal grounds not to approve it. Mr. Campbell stated that all supervisors, he, Mr. Ken Shultz, Township Engineer & Mr. John Lillebach, Adams Co Director of Planning, had investigated the site of access to the state road, all found it to be located on an extremely dangerous & hazardous stretch of road & that he as Board Solicitor, felt it his duty to advise against approving the plan. He felt that at some future date, this landowner or landowners situated behind the 19.8 acre lot may feel it was the board's responsibility to ensure a safe access or any access to a road at all. Mr. Frey stated he thought Mr. Lillebach was not on sound legal ground in ruling

the access point dangerous but Mr. Campbell replied that since Mr. Shantz had called him in as Consultant he felt his expertise in this area was quite sound. Mr. Haggart stated he withdrew a full subdivision plan because it was not financially possible for him to follow the regulations regarding road building & had then decided to sell his property in one lot, over 10 acre plots. He stated the buyer knows the situation & has made arrangements with a private contractor to cut access<sup>to</sup> the road, that all lots will be sold free single & that he does not anticipate building any roads on his property. Mr. Campbell ruled that the Board would not accept a gravel road, according to Subdivision regulations. Mr. Foyce asked if there was any possibility of obtaining a building permit for the Steplas, to which Mr. Campbell replied "at without a formal complete plan as outlined before, with the lots indicating access to a public road". Mr. Campbell stated he wished to discuss the matter further with the Supervisor, Messrs. Dally & Cullenback & would let Mr. Foyce know the results. Messrs. Foyce & Haggart then left the meeting. Chief Green opened the discussion by outlining the equipment and services provided by the Greenmount Firemen and discussing the boundary dispute with Gettysburg.

James Pitt, President of the Gettysburg Fire Department, outlined his viewpoint on the fire situation in portions of the Township, outlining a number of hypothetical cases showing that Greenmount would have to travel further to reach the fire than would the Gettysburg Firemen.

Neil Rothaupt, First Assistant Chief of the Greenmount Fire Company spoke of discussions on boundaries for the various fire companies at various meetings of the Adams County Fire Chiefs Association.

Gerald White, Gettysburg Fire Chief, outlined the numbering system Gettysburg Firemen are planning for their district, and noted that the use of the numbers will expedite arrival of the fire company to the scene of emergencies because reference to the number will disclose exactly where the fire or other emergency is located.

John Baugle of the Gettysburg Fire Department Ambulance Corps spoke of the service given by the ambulances which is free of charge to those within the Gettysburg Fire District but a charge is made outside the District. Allocation of all of Freedom Township to Greenmount removed from the Gettysburg District those areas previously served by Gettysburg, thus putting the residents of Freedom Township in the pay zone.

After a brief discussion among the Supervisors, they decided to stand by their decision of naming Greenmount Fire Company responsible for fire protection in the entire Township.

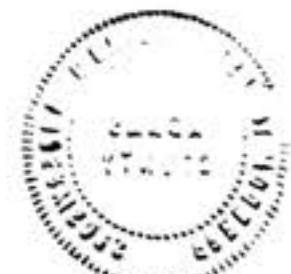
